

## LA GRANDE NINE PLAYS HALFWAY HERE ON SUNDAY

It was announced definitely today that the first Blue Mountain league baseball game of this season to be played in La Grande will take place on the high school athletic field Sunday afternoon, April 29, starting at 3 o'clock, when La Grande's Blue Mountain league team will meet the Halfway nine from the far eastern end of the circuit.

These two squads are at present tied for second place in the league standings, each having won two games and lost one. From all comparative

drops collected on the past performance of the two teams they stack up fairly even. Halfway having an edge over the local boys in pitching and defensive strength, while the La Grander have performed more powerfully at clouting the ball than the Halfwayers. Halfway lost its first game to Baker by a score of 14 to 9, and though actually losing the second game to Pendosa by a 1 to 0 score in ten innings, are credited with a win because of forfeiture by Pendosa.

The third game, played at Halfway last Sunday, resulted in a win over Elgin by a score of 10 to 1.

The La Grande squad started out the season with an especially tough contest when they took the Cove Cherrypickers into camp in a 12-inning affair at Cove by a score of 7 to 4. The next game at Union, resulted in a 14 to 10 victory for the La Grander, but they took one on

the nose from Pleasant Grove Grange last Sunday when they booted away a game by a score of 12 to 7.

The La Grande squad, according to D. W. Hall, manager, is in no frame of mind to be fooled with this week. "The boys blame only themselves for their shabby performance at Imbler last Sunday, and are full of determination to complete the entire remainder of the league's schedule without losing a game."

It is not expected that the work being done on the high school field will be entirely completed by Sunday, but the grounds should be in sufficiently good shape to accommodate the game, it is said. The infield is reported to be in good condition, the left and right outfields in fair condition, and it is expected that the only bad spot on the field will be in deep center. If the condition in this territory is so bad that it will

interfere with the game, ground rules, satisfactory to both aggregations will be adopted covering this particular territory before the game starts.

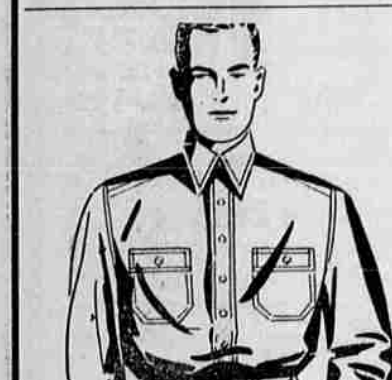

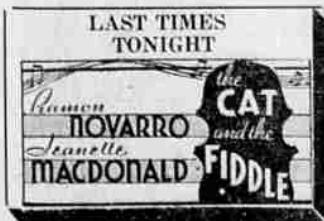
