Louise, seventh grade student, won in the upper grade division which included students of the seventh, eighth and ninth grades, and Edwin.

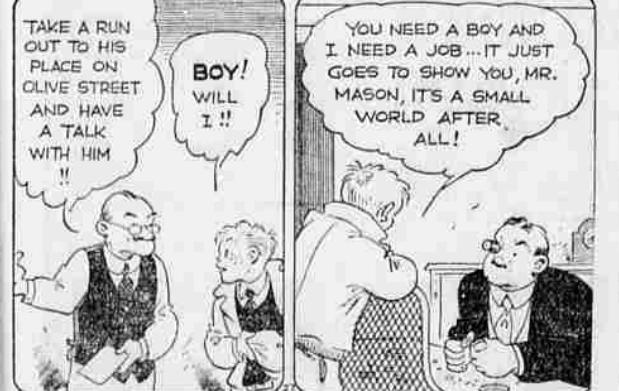
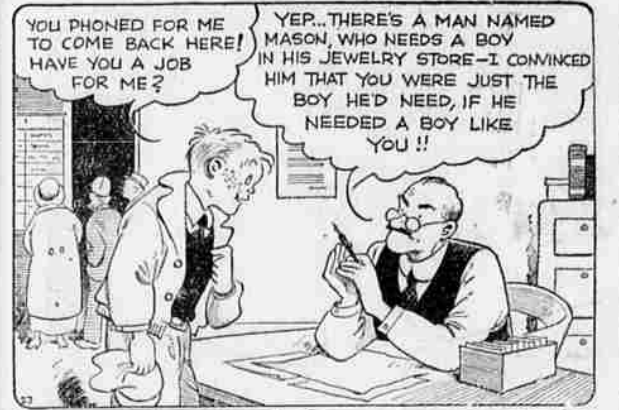
SCOUT HONOR COURT TO BE HELD TONIGHT

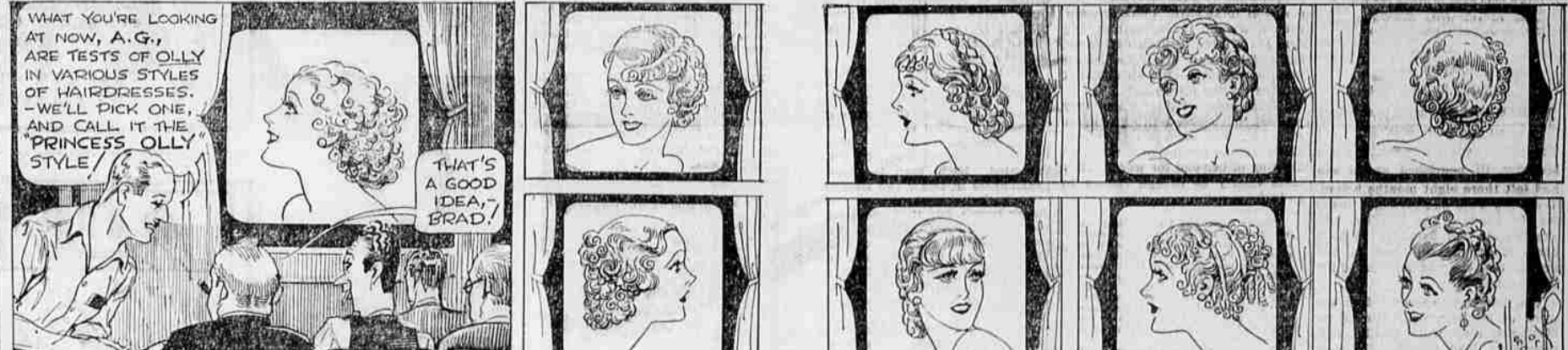
