There was not a church of any denomination here at that time, and the women made a very diligent solicitation of all the citizens, finally securing enough for the little church building which was erected on the corner across from the present home of Miss Susanna Deal, 402 Fourth street.

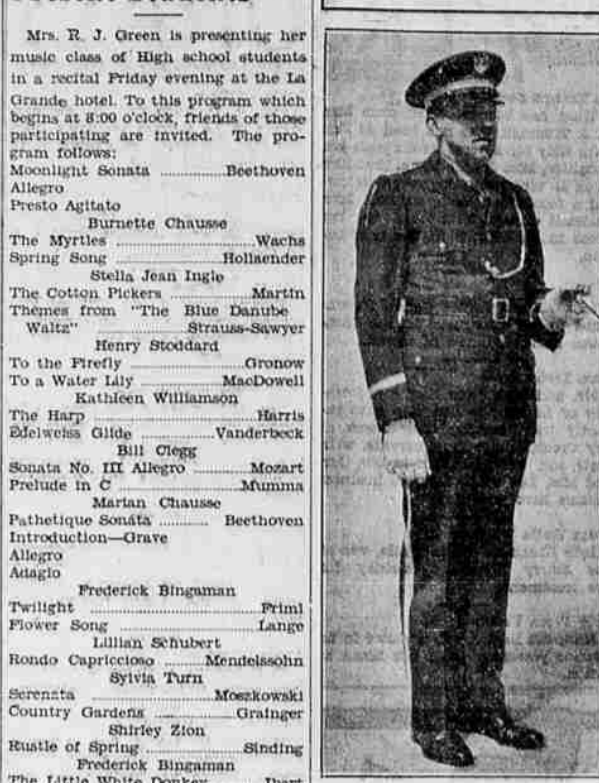
