stand against any inflation, following the silver slump, has killed interest here in the silver market and it is held likely that Britain took advantage of favorable conditions while they lasted.

Great Britain's war debt to the United States totals \$4,636,157,358. The next instalment on the British debt due, June 15, is \$85,670,765. The token payment made at the time the December British instalment fell due was \$7,500,000.
