

"Enkay" Milk Product From Modern Dairy

The N. K. West dairy ranch, north of La Grande and west of Summerville where is produced "Enkay" milk featured at the Safeway Stores school of kitchening, is known over the state, in fact over the northwest, as one of the most up-to-date plants in the matter of equipment and one of the most sanitary as to arrangement, care of the plant, of the animals and of the milk itself.

The large dairy barn erected in 1931 consists of three sections, so arranged that a minimum of labor is required with no retracing of steps in the immense volume of business carried on here. These are the west wing which is feed room, a clean, light and airy room 34x54 feet; the milk shed, a room 38 by 154 feet, having a capacity for 80 head of cows, and the milk room, or the east wing 360 3/4 by 84 feet.

Naturally the milk shed and the milk room are of first importance to the consumer of Enkay milk, although the rest of the equipment is interesting—including the two huge metal silos each having a capacity of 100 tons of ensilage, this also produced on the West ranch. In the milk shed, the stanchions stand in two long rows of 40-head capacity each, with the walkway about two feet higher. All the floors are of cement. The old carrier system used for bringing in the feed and taking out the litter has been replaced by a system much more sanitary and efficient. Twenty-five drains in the floor make it possible to flush the litter out into a septic tank. There is a great abundance of water piped into the dairy building, for those familiar with the West ranch know about the myriad of springs which furnish water and lots of it, the year around.

The milk room consists of several compartments—the receiving room, to which the milk is brought from the milk shed, then by elevator to the cooling room and on through the refrigeration room. Here also are the storage and bottling rooms. The ice plant has a capacity of two tons per day. In these refrigeration rooms the walls are tightly covered with four

Committee Corrects Error In Stories On Price of Gas

PORTLAND, May 8 — That recent statements in news dispatches from Salem have contained errors in facts as quoted in several instances that prices of gasoline in Portland and other parts of Oregon are higher than they are in Washington and in California, is set forth in a statement issued by the Oregon Petroleum Industries committee and released here by the chairman of the district sub-committee. The committee is representative of the oil industry in which over \$50,000,000 are invested in the state and feels that considerable unjust criticism has been directed at the industry as a result of lack of complete information in several news articles that have appeared.

"It is unfair to compare gasoline prices in Oregon with those that have resulted from a disastrous price war in parts of Washington and California where gasoline in some cases is being sold below cost," reads the statement. "Representatives of the entire Pacific coast gasoline refining industry are now meeting with a representative of Secretary Ickes, the president's petroleum administrator, in a serious attempt to stabilize the price structure and prevent further destructive price wars and at the same time insure a fair price to the consumer." It is declared.

Says State Will Find Itself In Red Buying Gas

The Salem Capitol Journal, in commenting editorially on the recent purchase of state gasoline to bring about "a cut in the retail price of gasoline to the consumer," has the following to say:

"It begins to look as though the effort of the state board of control, at the instance of William King to lower the price of gasoline through state purchase of gasoline in other states, would be a costly experiment and result in considerable loss.

Mr. Elzing has purchased 20,000 gallons of first structure gasoline at Tacoma at 5 1/2 cents a gallon f. o. b. Tacoma, about 2 cents a gallon less than the state now pays. The cost of transportation and storage rests with the state, and the state has no storage facilities and to erect storage tanks will involve a heavy investment, not only for a central storage tank, but one for each institution. When the state has added the cost of transportation, storage evaporation and leakage, it will probably find it-

self in the red as a result of going into the gasoline business. The state must purchase its gasoline from oil companies already established in Oregon. It cannot hope to handle it cheaper than the oil concerns can. The 2 cents or so saved by purchase in Tacoma over Salem delivery represents the added cost in delivery and service. Moreover, the possible saving to the state would not react in cutting price to the auto owner. The state has had, as a large consumer, the benefit of low costs, but they have never reacted to the benefit of the small consumer.

It is surprising that the members of the board of control, all good business men, should have off-handedly endorsed the gasoline venture without thorough investigation of the costs involved and the possible profits or losses."

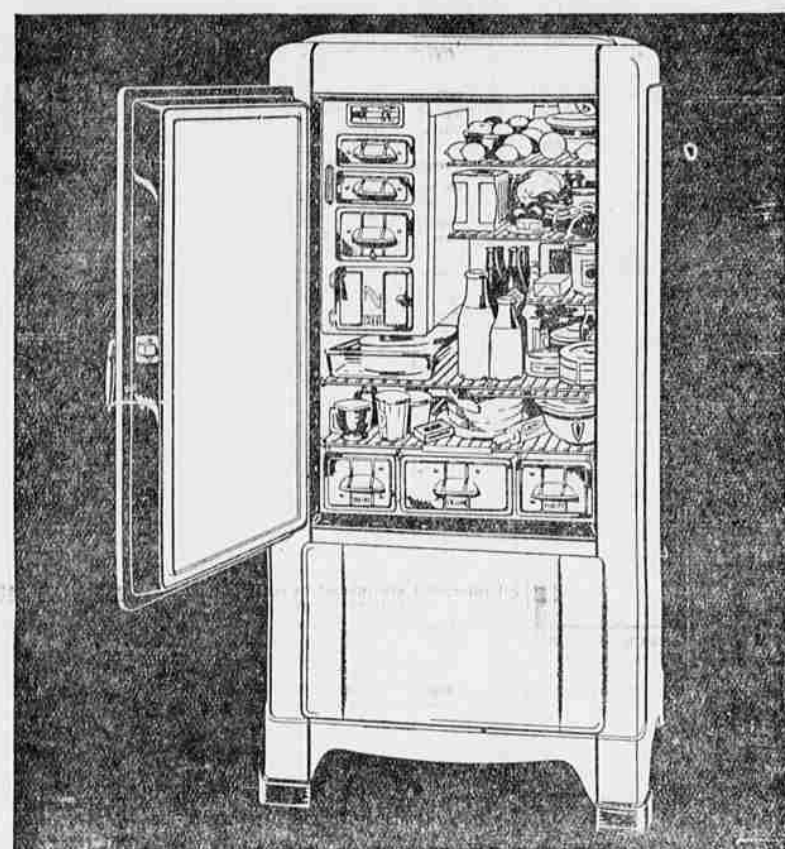
