With the three men in the case ready for San Quentin, authorities were undecided what to do with two women who were arrested when found in company of Kirk when he was taken into custody.

The two women, Lauretta Woody, 23, alias Ann Williams and Mona A. Galligan, 21, alias Joan Ward, are being held for suspicion of kidnaping.
