Among out-of-town guests were Mrs. Howard Pollock of Portland, Misses Jean Wilson and Kay Laughridge of Salem.

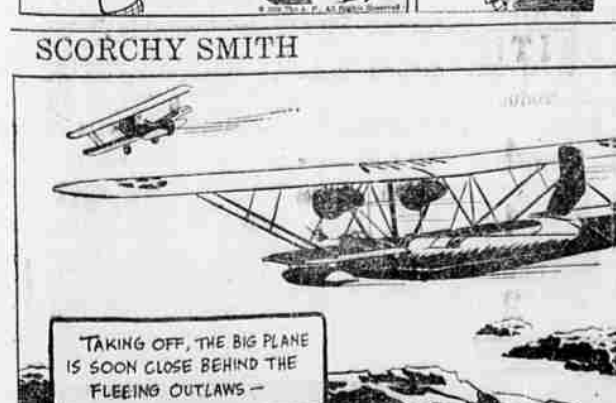
Mr. Wilson is the son of Mrs. Ella S. Wilson, of Salem.

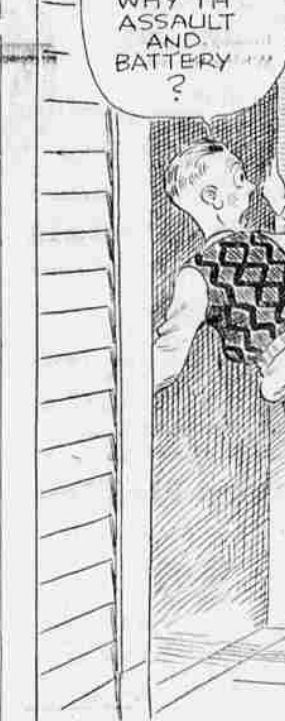

LOS ANGELES, Chile (AP) — Scarcity of passengers crossing the Andes since a melting glacier washed out part of the railroad, has caused the Chilean Transandinian company to suspend one of its two weekly combination trains and bus trips to Mendoza, Argentina.

## Life Loss Over Holiday is Heavy

The nation paid with at least 41 lives for its Memorial day celebration. Crowded highways took 13 lives, the heaviest toll; drownings, 8; airplane crashes, 7; automobile-train collisions, 3, and other causes, 6.

A woman fell from her New York apartment window. A farmer fell from a roof in Wisconsin. Two were killed in Texas, a deputy stabbed, and five others shot. In Rhode Island a farm hand, later killed by police, shot a state officer to death.

Felix Romano, three-month-old infant, escaped death in New York City when an automobile mounted the sidewalk and smashed his carriage to pieces. The impact threw Felix clear and the blankets he was wrapped in cushioned his fall.

At Gettysburg yesterday, declaring sectionalism past, the president condemned the "three elements" hindering progress which he declared to be: "Those who seek to stir up political animosity or to build political advantage by the distortion of facts; those who, by declining to follow the rules of the game seek to gain an unfair advantage over those who live up to the rules; and those few who still, because they never have been willing to take an interest in their fellow Americans, dwell inside of their own narrow spheres and still represent the selfishness of sectionalism which has no place in our national life."
