Last night, the Sequoia lay in the Connecticut river at Old Saybrook, leaving for this port shortly before 9 a. m. (eastern standard time).

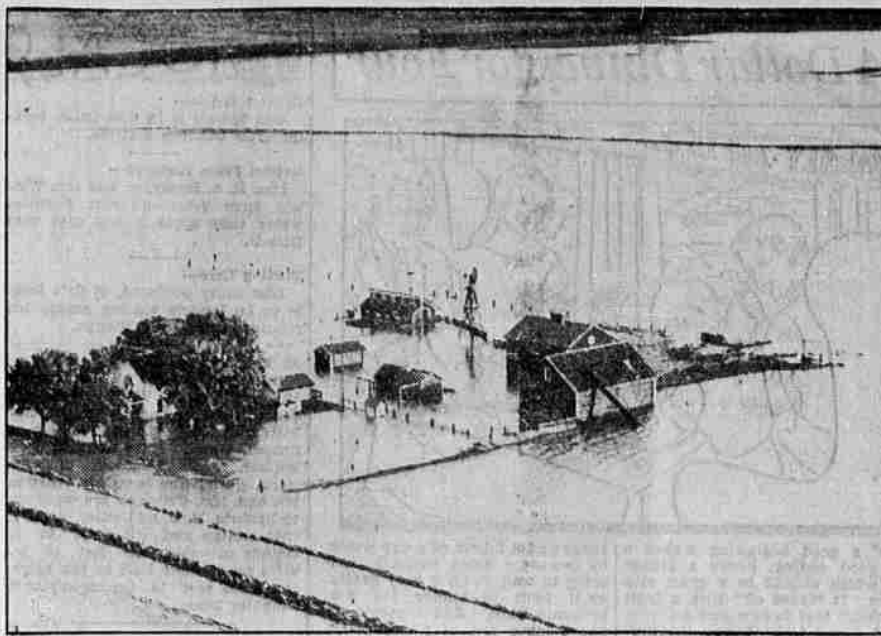
