Local Fans See Johnny Layton In Billiard Exhibition

Johnny Layton, world's champion three-cushion billiard player, entertained a large crowd last night at the Central Billiards with an hour and a quarter's exhibition of pocket billiards and fancy shots.

Starting out in a 125 point pocket billiards game, Layton broke, let his opponent shoot and miss, then ran 69, clearing the table four times and finally missing a difficult side-pocket shot. He finished the 125 in three more frames.

Following this game, Layton gave a demonstration of combination and fancy bank shots, shooting the balls from spot. He also demonstrated some trick shots in which unfair methods of hitting the balls were used, executed so rapidly as to appear legal.

Debt Payment Plan Is Read Before City Commission Meet

HITLER IS FACING NAZI SHOWDOWN

BERLIN, June 28 (AP) — Adolph Hitler stood today at a crossroad marked "right" and "left." Germany seethed while he debated his choice.

On the one hand there was the radical young wing of impetuous revolutionaries, typified by Joseph Goebbels, minister of propaganda, and Dr. Alfred Rosenberg, philosophic director of the third reich.

On the other side, bidding for Hitler's backing, was an older group of realistic-sub-leaders like Rudolph Hess, minister without portfolio; Wilhelm Frick, minister of interior, and Hermann Wilhelm Goering, minister of aviation, who want a social state in which private initiative and property are recognized.

Both groups have powerful organizations behind them.

ever, the bank is not sure that the \$8,000 mortgage is a 100 per cent asset. It asks the federal housing administrator to insure the mortgage.

He's Taking No Chances

After investigation and the payment of a fee of not less than one half of one per cent, the administrator may insure the mortgage. He may even accept it himself and pay the cash to the bank.

No individual mortgage insured may be for longer than 20 years, bear more than 6 per cent interest, or be for more than 80 per cent of the appraised value of the property the day the mortgage is executed. Nor may an insured home mortgage exceed \$16,000. Mortgages also may be insured on new homes.

Another phase of the bill allows the federal housing administrator to insure up to 20 per cent of the total loans made by a bank for modernization and repair. These loans may be simple personal notes and for the smaller sums, officials say, they probably will be. No loan in this category could exceed \$2,000.

To help the home owner find a market for his mortgage, the bill authorizes the creation of national mortgage associations, which are empowered to rediscount the paper. They must have a \$5,000,000 capital and may have stock outstanding to a total of \$50,000,000.
