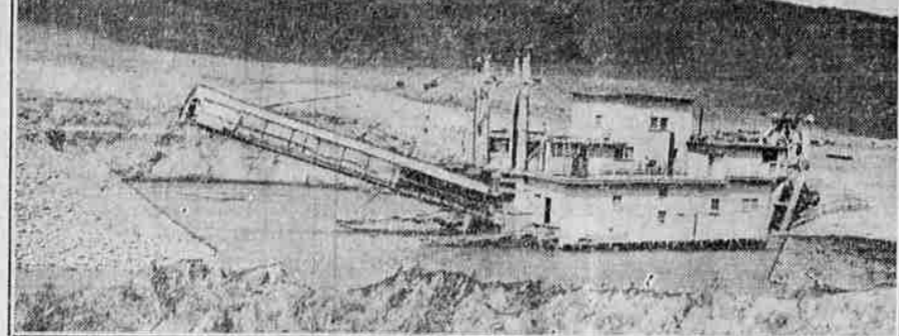
The Imbler L. D. S. Relief society met with the Elgin Relief society Tuesday afternoon. Stake officers from La Grande were present.

FISCAL YEAR FOR STATE ENDS TODAY

SALEM, June 30 (AP)—The fiscal year for all state departments ends today, under the new 1933 legislative act, it was announced by the secretary of state. The first half of the second year of the biennial as set out under the new schedule ends December 31. The 1935 legislature then will appropriate for the last six months, and also for the next two years for the new biennial, thus eliminating back appropriations during legislative years from January until the end of the session, usually in March.
