

PORTLAND WINS ONE GAME FROM L. A. IN SERIES

It's beginning to look as if Jack Lelivelt's highly efficient Angels aren't interested in a tight battle for the 1934 Coast League pennant. One week of play in the second half of the split season—split so the other teams could start all even with the Angels and stay there—found Los Angeles alone atop the league with a record of six victories and one defeat. Portland was the initial victim, taking only the last game of the series, 3-2. Dutch Ulrich's seven hit tossing gave the Beavers the Sunday nightcap after they had taken a 4-3 trimming in the opener and been blanked 3-0 Saturday by Emmett Nelson.

Hollywood captured the league's best weekend show from Oakland, 7-8, after a 15-inning tussle at Los Angeles. The nightcap was called at the end of the seventh because of darkness, with the count 3-3.

After a slow start Sacramento finished the week strong to take all three weekend engagements from the Missions and the series, 4-3.

Only Joe Marty's seventh inning single kept Bill Radomits of Seattle from being numbered among the Coast League immortals who have pitched no-hit games. He gave just the one hit as he beat San Francisco 2-1 in the Sunday second game. Previously the San Franciscans had upset Seattle 6-1 in the opener.

Bonthron 1 Up On Cunningham For The Season

MILWAUKEE, July 2 (AP)—Bill Bonthron of Princeton and Glenn Cunningham of Kansas have finished their foot-racing feud for the season, with Bill the victor.

The famous Bonthron finishing drive gave the Princeton ace his third victory in five meetings with Cunningham—and a new world record of 3:45.2 for 1,500 meters—in the finals Saturday of the senior A. A. U. championships.

Huge Jack Torrance and Glen Hardin, the Louisiana State university stars; and a pair of California high jumpers, Cornelius Johnson and Walter Marty, shared Bonthron's glory.

Torrance got off a mighty heave of 55 feet, 5 inches to wipe out a lot of pending marks in the 16-pound shot. It was 2 feet 9 1/2 inches better than the recognized world mark, and added inches to his own best previous achievement of 55 feet, 1 1/2 inches. Hardin remained out of the 400 meters flat event to concentrate on the 400 meter hurdles and came up with a world record. He won easily in 51.8 seconds, two tenths faster than the approved standard.

Johnson and Marty tied at 6 feet, 8 1/2 inches in the high jump, bettering Harold Osborn's official mark by three-eighths of an inch, but falling a little short of Marty's pending mark of 6 feet, 9 1/2 inches.

Ralph Metcalfe, Marquette university's "fastest human," won the 100 and 200 meters, to become the second individual in the history of the meet to win the two short races three years in a row.
