## 4-H Clubs To Enter Weed Control Contest

A 50-pound drum of Atlacide for fourth prize.

To be eligible for these prizes, club members must make a survey of five sections of land on which they must locate all patches of any of the following perennial weeds which might occur: white top, field morning glory, Canada thistle, Russian knap weed, death weed (poverty weed) and fond flax. After finding these, they must be located on maps which may be secured from the office of the county agent. They are also required to make mounts of each perennial weed which they find on the allotted land and with this mounting is to be included a brief write-up on the various crops on which the weed is locally troublesome, its growth habits, means of spread and methods of control. The awards will be made following the display of these projects at the Grange Fair.

H. H. Rampton, assistant county agent, reports that one club in the county has already started on its project. The Wolf Creek Pig club of North Powder is the first to begin its work and Rampton has spent one day with the members to help identify the weeds for their display. Others are expected to enter the contest in the near future and a large display is expected, according to Rampton.

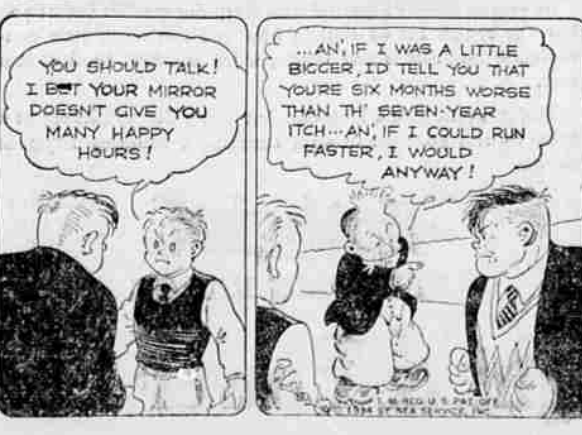
## EIGHT WORKS OF ART COME TO E. O. SCHOOL

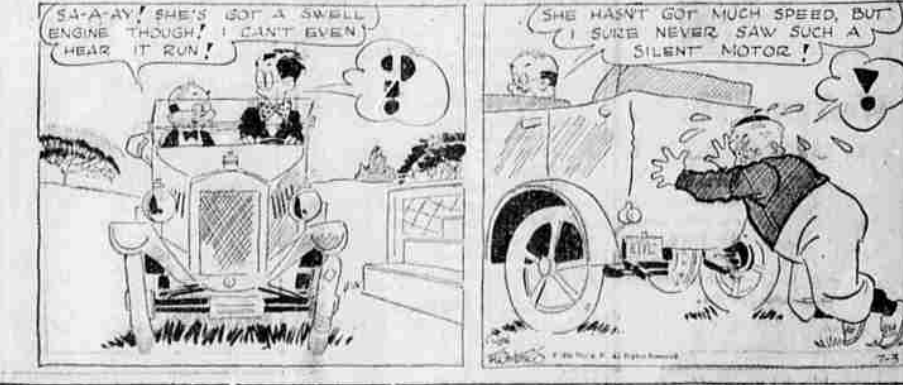
