Sixty-seven varieties of azaleas grow in a public park known as Azalea Ravine gardens at Palakia, Fla.

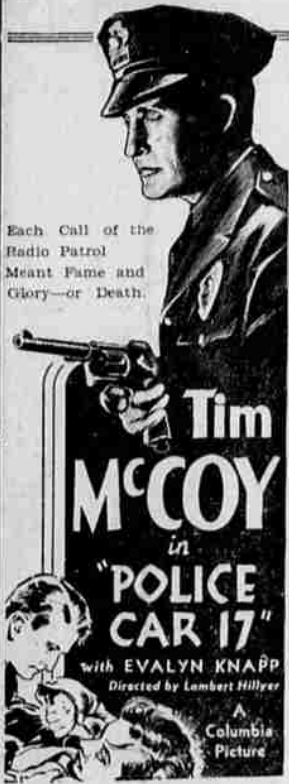
AGED WOMAN IS HURT IN WRECK
