RETAIL TRADE GAINS SHOW FOR 9 MONTHS

with the increase shown for the April-December period of 1929 indicates the gain shown throughout the state was substantially more than seasonal, said William L. Austin, director of the bureau of census.

The number of stores dropped 6 per cent during 1933 compared with 1929, the total decreasing from 14,570 to 13,749. The dollar volume of retail sales showed a decline of 51 per cent from the pre-depression year. The amount of business in 1933 was \$224,288,000 compared with \$455,931,000 in 1929.

The full-time payroll in 1933 was 59 per cent lower than in 1929, but the number of full-time employees was only 37 per cent less. The average full-time wage in 1929 was \$1,900 while it was shown to have declined to \$971 last year.

Full-time employed persons in 1933 in Oregon totaled 22,261 compared with 35,579 in 1929. Part-time employees increased to 6,415 persons compared with 4,935 in 1929. The total payroll for last year was given as \$24,037,000 in all retail establishments, against \$48,153,700 in 1929.

Following is a summary of sales, employment and salaries for 1933 by Eastern Oregon counties. The average number of employees in the tabulation represents both full-time and part-time workers, while the total payrolls combine the salaries and wages of the two groups but does not include compensations to proprietors who took an active part in the business.

(Continued from Page One) Buying of cattle is being "dovetailed" with other plans of the administration, he added, and recent rains in the drought area have not changed the situation materially from conditions early in the week, when it was estimated by administration officials that 4,091,000 cattle in 23 states must be removed immediately for slaughtering or pasture feeding in surplus feed areas.

Rains will make it possible to develop relief plans "in a little more orderly fashion," he said. Buying of cattle with extension of the program to include sheep may have to be carried beyond next spring, the secretary said.
