Umatilla, Cayuse and Walla Walla Indians in U. P. Celebration.

PLAN TO CAMP ON ANDERSON PLACE

Ceremonial Dance to Be Featured in Pageant to Be Held Saturday, July 21.

A large group of Umatilla, Cayuse and Walla Walla Indians will form one of the most interesting sections of the Friday morning parade here next week during the semi-centennial U. P. celebration. It will be the first time in 30 or more years that Indians have taken part in a parade in La Grande. In addition, the Indians will appear in the Saturday afternoon pageant at the La Grande stadium.

Thirty Indians from the Umatilla, Cayuse and Walla Walla tribes will be here headed by Gilbert Minthorn, chairman of the Indian council at Cayuse.

The Indians are to camp on the Hubert Anderson place by the Grande Ronde river, and probably will arrive by next Tuesday. Their horses are being herded across the Blue Mountains and are not expected until Wednesday, July 18.

The Indians will present in full tribal regalia—a ceremonial dance in the pageant—and in addition four Indian women and girls will participate in the pageant.

The Friday parade will start promptly at 9:30, the celebration committee is emphasizing. It is necessary that there be no delay because of later activities, and anyone late getting into the line of march will simply be out of luck.

Those entering floats are urged to register immediately with the chamber of commerce, and then contact the chairman of the division in which the float is to be entered. Walter A. Bean is chairman of the patriotic division, Vernon Bull, railroad and fraternal; Homer Lefel, commercial, and Arch Parker, Indians and miscellaneous.

Quite a number of floats already have been registered.

Stimulation Of Lumber Industry In '35 Predicted

WASHINGTON, July 11 (AP)—Stimulation of the lumber industry of the far west to such an extent that consumption in 1935 will be at least 143 per cent of that for 1934 was predicted today.

After pointing out that present consumption of lumber was proceeding at a rate which probably would mean a total of 17,800,000,000 feet for 1934, Dr. Wilson Compton, general manager of the National Lumber Manufacturers association, said that under the administration housing program "with proper ancillary activity on the part of the industries themselves," consumption could be increased to a total of at least 25,000,000,000 feet next year.

Such an increase would mean a net gain of approximately 43

WHEAT PRICE UP 5 CENTS OVER NATION

Sensational Gain Due to Government Crop Report Issued Tuesday

Wheat prices generally throughout the nation advanced five cents today over Tuesday's closing. Portland cash today was listed at 74 cents, compared with 69 cents yesterday, and local cash wheat was up to about 56 cents, compared with 51 1/2 yesterday.

CHICAGO, July 11 (AP)—Grain markets were electrified today as a result of the sensational government crop report placing the nation's 1934 production of grain at the lowest figure in 33 years. Wheat prices soared five cents on the opening transactions, the limit permitted in a day's

Wheat Today

The price of local cash wheat stood at about 56 cents bulk here today, the highest this year, according to the Pioneer Flouring Mills. On Jan. 30 the high was 55 1/2 cents. Portland cash 74 cents. No export bid.

CHICAGO, July 11 (AP)—Straining against arbitrary high price restraints, wheat and corn worked themselves to a standstill late today, reaching a point where all offerings ceased. Maximum prices for today were reached and maintained owing to what was generally regarded as the most sensational government crop loss report ever issued from Washington. For a while oats, rye and barley afforded a refuge for traders who were stopped in wheat and corn, but finally every grain on the list was up to the limit.

Wheat and all other grains closed August wheat up 5c, corn 4c, and oats 3c. September new wheat 93 1/2c. Maximums closed unchanged to 17c higher.

LIQUOR LOSES IN MISSISSIPPI VOTE

JACKSON, Miss., July 11 (AP)—Mississippi held its place among the dry states today by a vote of approximately 2 to 1.

Incomplete, unofficial returns from yesterday's prohibition referendum showed defeat of the hard liquor bill by a vote of 47,275 to 25,246 in 658 of the 1,596 precincts of the state.

The wet conceded defeat. Senator W. B. Roberts of Rosedale, co-author of the Roberts-May compromise hard liquor legalization bill, said the result was a "mandate to the governor, sheriffs and other peace officers to make a determined effort to enforce the present laws and end the present unspeakable conditions."

By voting dry the people rebuked their legislature. The last legislature authorized beer at the same time it put the liquor issue before the voters and four per cent beer was just as far as Mississippians chose to go in the legalization of alcoholic beverages.

4 INJURED BY BUCKSHOT IN CLASH TODAY

Officers Fire Shotguns Into Crowd of Longshore Pickets.

CITY COUNCIL TO INVESTIGATE CASE

None of Men Injured Fatally—Bloody Shirt Waved at Meeting of City Dads.

SAN FRANCISCO, July 11 (AP)—A pledge to co-operate fully with President Roosevelt's labor disputes board in negotiations to settle the maritime strike and thereby prevent a possible general walkout of other trades was made here today by the waterfront employers.

PORTLAND, July 11 (AP)—Blood was spilled here today as police fired shotguns into a crowd of pickets on Portland's strike-torn waterfront.

Four men, all striking longshoremen, were wounded by buckshot from the police guns. The four were members of a large group of pickets who blocked a railroad track and prevented a freight train from moving a municipal terminal. Hospitals said none of the four will die. About a dozen shots were fired.

Labor groups and the city council immediately started an investigation of the shooting.

It was feared by many observers the bloodshed would precipitate a general city-wide strike by more than 90 of the city's 105 labor unions. This general strike has been threatened for several days.

Jacksonville, Ill. Hit By Tornado—Several Injured

JACKSONVILLE, Ill., July 11 (AP)—Hail, rain and a tornado left Jacksonville strewn today with the litter of wrecked homes and garages, uprooted trees and a snarl of broken communication lines.

Sweeping down on the city and neighboring farms last night, the storm caused property damage unofficially estimated at \$750,0
