Dust Storms In Minnesota Help Duck Situation

ST. PAUL (AP) — Minnesota sportsmen are thanking Mother Nature for this year's duck storms.

For years duck hunters have blamed the gradual lowering of the state's 10,000 lakes to the drainage ditch "spree" which the state inaugurated about 20 years ago.

Recurring droughts of recent years have circumvented the need for drainage ditches. Whereas years ago, vast areas of rich low ground were under water, now most of the sloughs have dried up.

This destroyed valuable nesting grounds for ducks, and cut in so heavily on duck breeding facilities that clouds of fowl were conspicuously absent during shooting seasons.

Now sportsmen believe that a return of normal precipitation, combined with the filling of many drainage ditches with top-soil carried from cultivated fields, will restore the sloughs and gradually solve Minnesota's duck supply problem.

GIBBONS FINDS POLITICS TOUGH A GRIND AS RING. ST. PAUL (AP) — Tommy Gibbons must wait until November for a decision in his latest battle—this time political, not fistie.

He squeezed into the finals of the race for sheriff in Ramsey county, winning the nomination by only 213 votes. The election will determine whether he gets the job.

Gibbons is finding his political debut considerably more prolonged than his famous scrap at Shelby, Mont., where he stayed 15 rounds against Jack Dempsey.

NORTHWEST GETS 152 MILLIONS IN FEDERAL MONEY

By H. C. Hunter. (Pacific Northwest AP Correspondent) WASHINGTON (AP)—Federal money, totaling \$152,322,388 has poured into the states of Oregon, Washington, California and Idaho during the past two years through reconstruction finance corporation loans to banks and irrigation districts.

In addition \$62,034,350 has been disbursed in those states through the Home Owners Loan corporation, making a total of \$214,356,738 which has been loaned to organizations and individuals between February 2, 1932 and June 23, 1934.

These loans were shown in a compilation of figures obtained from the two federal organizations.

While the total loans of the RFC to irrigation projects and banks and the HOLC loans on homes, represented almost a quarter of a billion dollars, it was revealed that the RFC alone had authorized advances totaling \$501,407,494 for all purposes in those states and had disbursed \$336,006,596, or more than \$100,000,000 in addition to the money expended for specified purposes.

Banks obtained the lion's share of the money disbursed, receiving \$136,915,873, or 40.5 per cent of the total.

California led the field in obtaining federal money for lagging banks and irrigation projects, the advances to the former, amounting to \$113,246,250.77 and the latter \$11,019,901.40.

Washington state, while in second place in obtaining federal funds for irrigation, banks and home owners, was far below the California total, with but \$28,543,541, of which \$13,200,707 was in the form of loans to banks and \$1,068,495 to irrigation districts.

The Home Owners Loan corporation disbursements in the state totaled \$12,269,339, leaving the RFC disbursed at \$16,274,202.

Unlike the two previous states, home owners' loans topped the figures for third place Oregon, totaling \$7,990,140 as compared with \$5,975,260 and \$2,292,106 disbursed to banks and irrigation districts respectively by the RFC. The total amount sent into Oregon by loans on the three items was \$16,225,506. Total RFC disbursements were \$11,981,548, and loans authorized, \$16,682,682.

HARTSDALE, N. Y., July 13 (AP)—An army of 500 state troopers, police and volunteers beat through dense woodlands around Hartsdale today for blue-eyed, 16-month-old Bobby Connor, feared kidnapped.

Authorities said they were convinced the child, missing since 6 o'clock last night, was being held for ransom. He is the son of Charles H. Connor, mortgage broker, and the grandson of Charles P. Connor, wealthy retired New England clothier.

Bloodhounds failed to pick up the trail of the child.
