The band, the first out-of-town musical organization to arrive here,

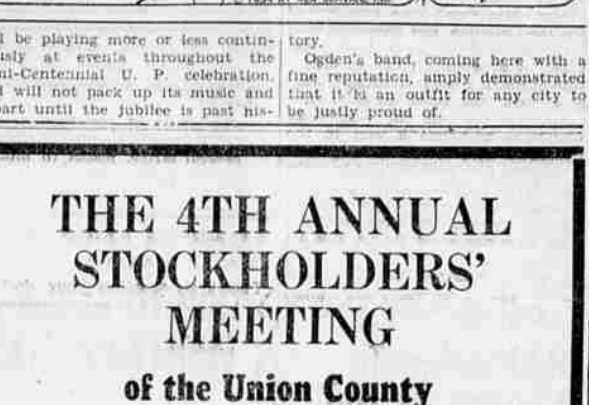
