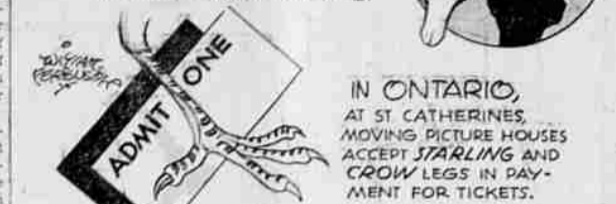
1934 Olympic results are not posted on the basis of what happens in 1934. We have enjoyed some of these amazing athletic spurs before, usually during the indoor season, only to experience a rude awakening on the fields of international competition at a later date. Americans have an optimistic habit of claiming everything in sight for any lad who lifts himself above the pack for the time being. A dash of British conservatism and restraint would make us happier and more level-headed over the long run.

Moreover, those who concede the U. S. A. the 1,500-meter run, mile equivalent of the Olympic program, this far in advance, must reckon with at least two circumstances: (1) that neither Bill Bombroon nor Glenn Cunningham may choose to remain in competition for two more years to the detriment of their business careers; and (2) that a number of other runners, including Jack Lovelock of New Zealand and Luigi Beccali of Italy, have demonstrated they can move a bit faster than either of our American coaches, right now, would not predict a triumph for either Bombroon or Cunningham over Beccali, the slim, black-haired Italian who ran away with the Olympic 1,500 two years ago, leaving Cunningham, among others, staggering in his tiring wake.
