

NEW TYPE LOGGING TRAILER MADE BY LA GRANDE FIRM

The Larson-Frees Chevrolet Co. has been manufacturing for the past six months an entirely new type logging trailer that has enjoyed widespread acceptance and satisfaction. It is of a new and advanced design and was built to facilitate the handling of logs from the woods to the mill.

A five ton tubular cambered axle is used in conjunction with heavy duty wheels and 26 leaf springs. The frame of the trailer is made of six inch H iron, heavily reinforced and riveted securely to it are new type spring shackles. The double bunk principle is utilized and the bunks also are made of six inch H iron.

The trailer is unique in that it can be loaded on the truck for the return trip to the woods. A loading device with a three to one ratio has been built which pulls the trailer onto the truck. A collapsible tongue guide also is used. These trailers have been loaded by one man in one and a half minutes.

A state-supervised hiring hall through which the workers were to be dispatched to jobs, was not opened.

Labor leaders said the Portland longshoremen would not return to work under any temporary proposal unless this was authorized by William J. Lewis, president of their Pacific coast union.

Governor Meier last night proposed a temporary solution of the dispute over hiring halls—a controversy that prolonged the protracted waterfront strike. He ordered a hall opened under state supervision and assigned Otto R. Hartwig, state industrial accident commissioner, to direct its operation. Police guards were maintained around seven ships loading cargo with non-union workers.

Late yesterday pickets were successful in "persuading" a train crew not to switch seven loaded freight cars alongside a vessel in the harbor. "Beat-up" gangs continued to circu-

late through the "north end" waterfront area. Four persons were wounded by these gangs yesterday.
