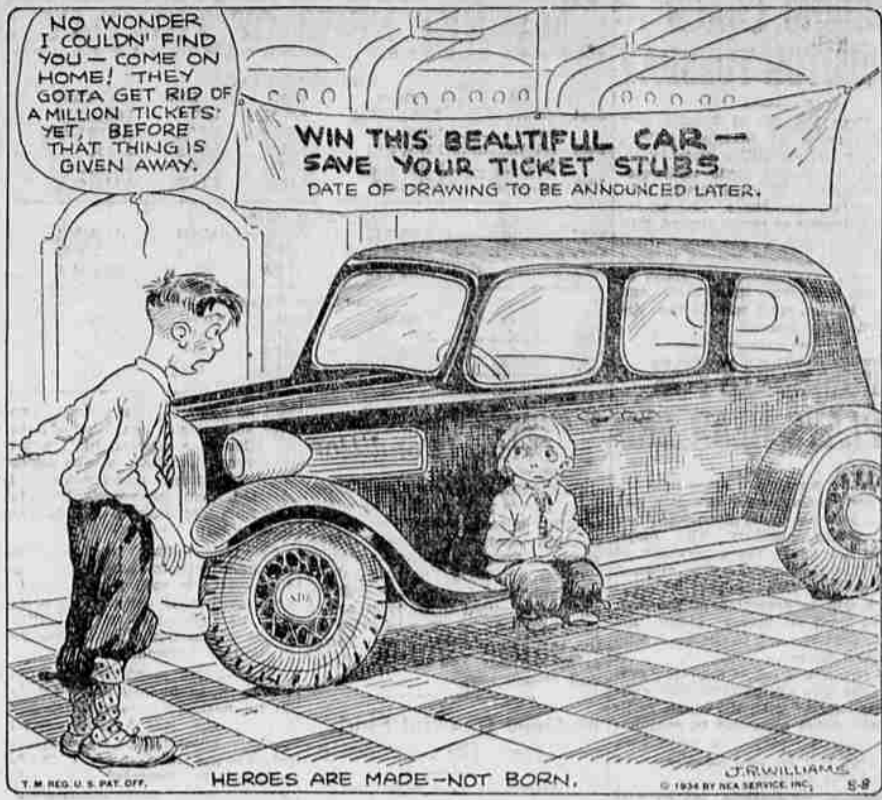

CHICAGO WHITE SOX GET HAFEY FROM MISSIONS

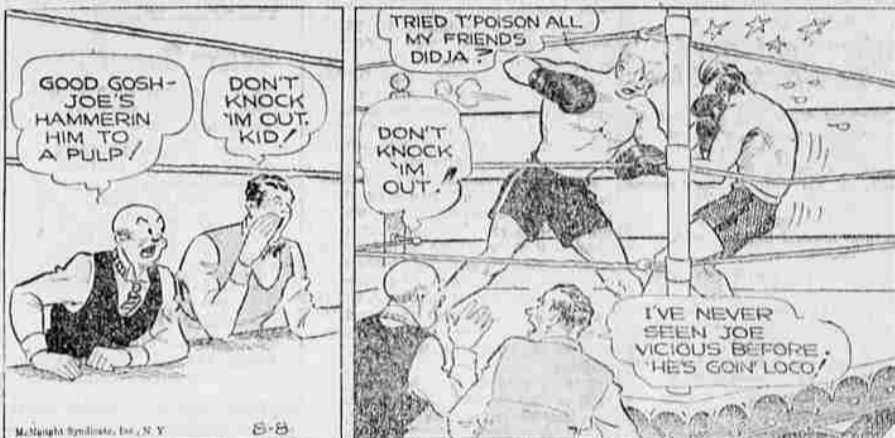

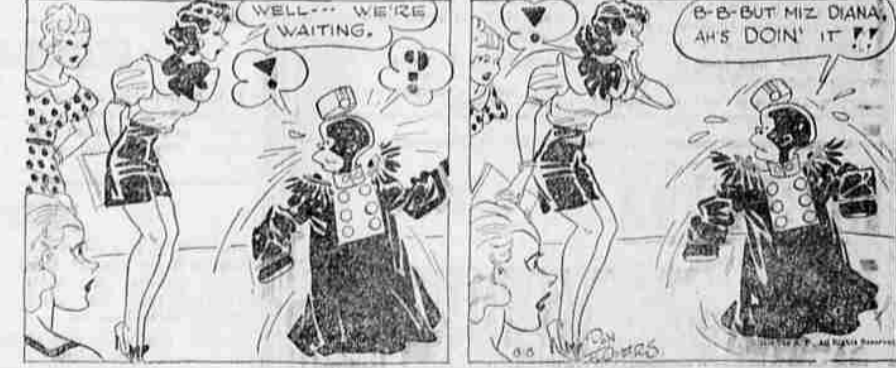
