Funeral services will be held tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Snodgrass and Zimmerman mortuary with Rev. Paul De P. Mortimore in charge. Burial will take place in the Island City cemetery.

Mrs. Wallace had made her home in California for many years but came to La Grande about four months ago because of ill health. She was born in Richland, Minn., Sept. 18, 1875 and was 55 years, 10 months and 27 days of age. Besides her son, she leaves a granddaughter, two sisters, Mrs. Fred Landgraff, of Canada; Mrs. A. O. Molden, of Los Angeles; and two brothers, C. C. Gowen, of Chehalis, Wash., and Floyd Gowen, of Sedro Wooley, Wash.

She was a member of the Bebekah Lodge in Canada, the Women's Benefit association in Long Beach and the Royal Neighbors of America in Sauk Center, Minn.
