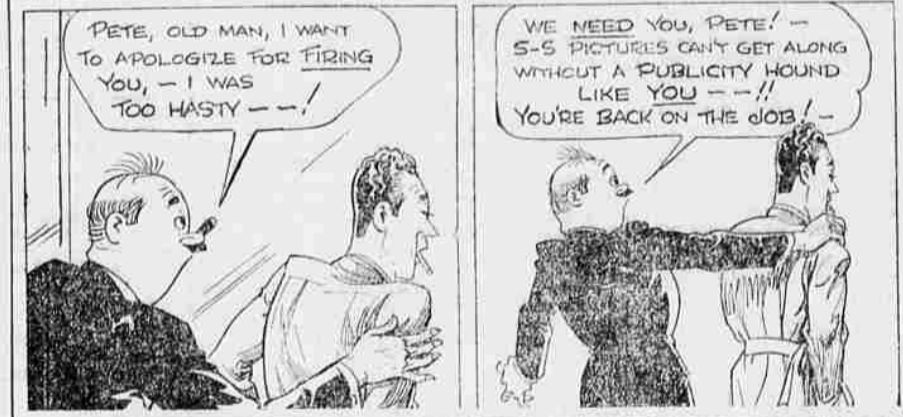
LAW REQUIRES BEEF CATTLE TO BE TAGGED

Although many farmers are unaware of the provisions of the state law, it is unlawful to transport or sell meat food animal carcasses unless there is attached to same a tag containing the following information—name and address of owner, when and where carcass was slaughtered and by whom; a description of the brand or other distinctive marking, and any other information the state commissioner may think necessary. Also, it is unlawful, state officials report, for one to transport or sell a beef carcass without the hide accompanying it. Tags may be obtained by application at the sheriff's office.

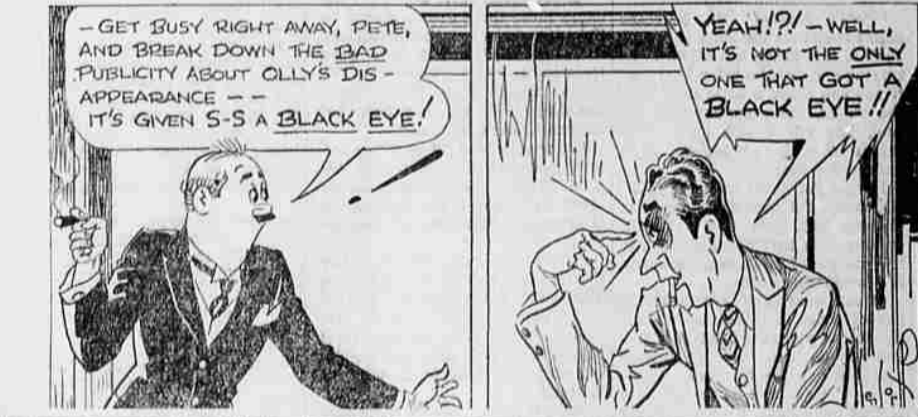
