Japanese Eyes Are Turned to Arizona

PHOENIX, Ariz., Aug. 22 (AP)—The federal government urged Governor D. B. Moore today to use every precaution at his command to prevent strained relations between the United States and Japan in connection with the Salt River valley farmer-Japanese controversy, expected to come to a head Saturday.

Governor Moore was advised by William Phillips, acting secretary of state at Washington, that the Japanese embassy there has expressed apprehension over the situation, and has taken the matter up with the state department.

He referred to an ultimatum delivered last week by farmers in the Fowler district, that all Japanese must be out of the valley by Saturday night, or steps would be taken to move them out.

GUARDSMEN QUIT MINNEAPOLIS AS STRIKE IS ENDED

The military returned Minneapolis to the citizenry today — the truck drivers' strike was over. Agreement of the truck owners to take back strikers without discrimination paved way for the acceptance of peace plans advanced by federal negotiators. Shouting drivers last night announced the union's almost unanimous vote to return to work.

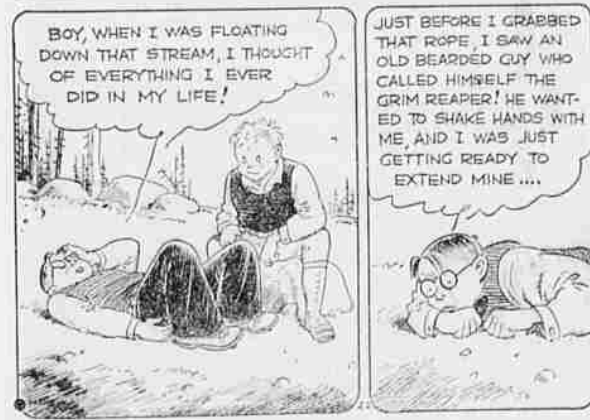
Governor Floyd B. Olson said military rule would be revoked, presence of the military pardoned, national guardmen withdrawn. Four deaths had resulted from the five-week strike.

Settlement of the garment workers' strike in Boston also was effected.

Other strikes, including the impending nation-wide walkout of taxicab drivers, were in the conference stage.

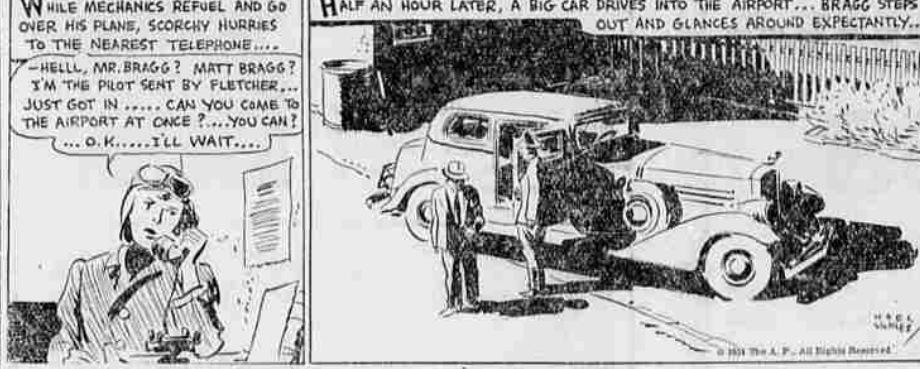

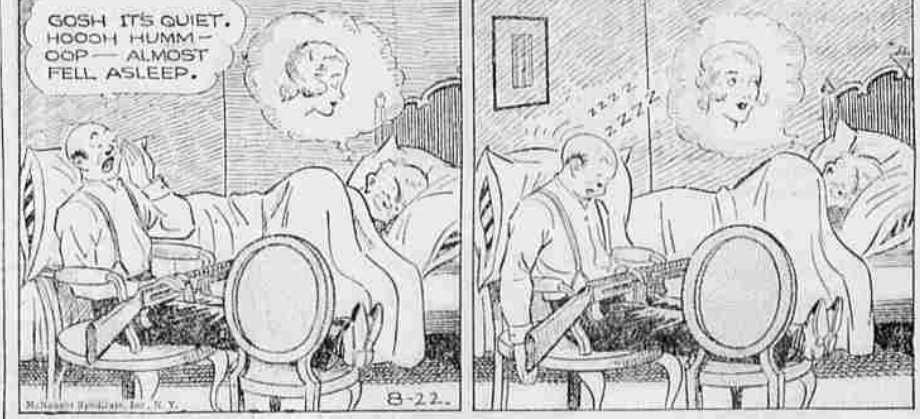
