### RICH AIR SPEED PRIZES LURE TO FINEST PILOTS

LONDON (AP)—Crack fliers of 15 countries—more than a score of them from the United States—will roar away October 20 from London in a gruelling dash to Melbourne for the richest prize of contemporary aviation.

The greatest air derby yet projected, for its distance of more than 11,000 miles, its total prize money of \$75,000 and its entry list of internationally famous pilots, the competition is a double-barreled one combining an "absolute speed" race and a handicap event.

**Candy Maker Gives Prizes**  
Staged in connection with the centenary celebrations of Victoria and Melbourne, the contests are sponsored THOUSAND EXTRA MILES

**FACE CAUTIOUS PILOTS**  
LONDON (AP)—Fliers in the London-Melbourne air race who make only the five compulsory landings will travel nearly 1,000 miles less than those who elect to make all optional landings.

Compulsory landing points, with distances, are: London to Baghdad, 2,553 miles; to Allahabad, 2,300 miles; to Singapore, 2,210 miles; to Darwin, 2,084 miles; to Charleville, 1,369 miles; to Melbourne, 787 miles. Total, 11,232 miles.

The optional route is: London, Marseilles, Rome, Athens, Aleppo, Baghdad, Bushire, Jask, Karachi, Jodhpur, Allahabad, Calcutta, Rangoon, Bangkok, Aior Star, Singapore, Batavia, Rambang, Koenig, Darwin, Newcastle Waters, Cloncurry, Charleville, Narramine and Melbourne. Total 12,277 miles.

Sir Macpherson Robertson, Australian candy manufacturer, and have named officially the "Robertson international air race."

Sixty-four planes have been entered for the dual event. Nine will try for the speed prizes of \$50,000 and a gold cup for first place, \$7,500 for second and \$2,500 for third; 28 will fly in both divisions simultaneously and 27 seek only the handicap prizes of

\$10,000 for the winner and \$5,000 for the runner-up.  
Though the present England-Australia record is 6 days, 17 hours and 56 minutes, fliers are predicting that the time of the speed race winner will be close to four days.

**Everything Goes in Routes**  
Day and night flying, refueling in the air—nothing is barred in either division of the race except that competitors must land at five designated points en route, Baghdad, Allahabad, Singapore, Darwin and Charleville.

These dashes average 2,000 miles each but in addition there are optional landing places at an average distance of 500 miles, primarily for the planes racing under handicaps arranged according to their wing areas, pay loads and horsepower.

Seven of the nine "absolute speed" entries are American, including Col. Roscoe Turner, transcontinental record holder; Wiley Post, round-the-world flier; Clyde Pangborn, globe-circler; Miss Laura Ingalls; Herbert V. Thaden and his wife, Louise Thaden; and Lieut. Col. G. R. Hutchinson.

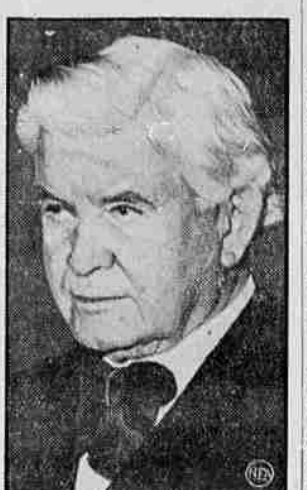
**Europe's Aces in Lists**  
Internationally known fliers who have won their spurs in long-distance flights in both hemispheres are among those who have their eyes on both the speed and handicap prizes.

They include Mr. and Mrs. J. A. Mollison, transatlantic fliers and both former holders of England-Australia records; and Sir Charles Kingsford-Smith, who first won fame for his 1928 transpacific flight and who holds the solo England-Australia record of 7 days, 4 hours and 47 minutes.

Others are Col. J. C. Fitzmaurice, of the Irish Free State, co-pilot of the first successful east-west Atlantic flight, in 1928; C. W. A. Scott, former England-Australia record holder; and Michel Detroyat, French aerobatic ace.

**Dual Prizes Attractive**  
Americans out for the dual prizes include Russell A. Hovler, Huntington, Ind.; Harry Lyon, former flying comrade of Sir Charles Kingsford-Smith, and R. F. Lape, San Francisco; Jacqueline Cochran and Wesley Smith, New York City; Capt. F. Rose, flying the entry of Walter T. Varney, Palm Springs, Cal.; J. E. Granger, flying the entry of Keith Elder, Los Angeles; and J. Frye and H. Hull, Mary.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 24 (AP)—Every one looked toward the white house today to see how President Roosevelt would react to the American Liberty League.

Although the new-born league seemed to some observers to be a forerunner of shattered party lines and a new alignment of "right" camp against "left" it evoked also a demonstration that party ties have strength.

Five Democratic senators—whose names had been mentioned in connection with the league—made a public declaration of loyalty to the Roosevelt administration.
