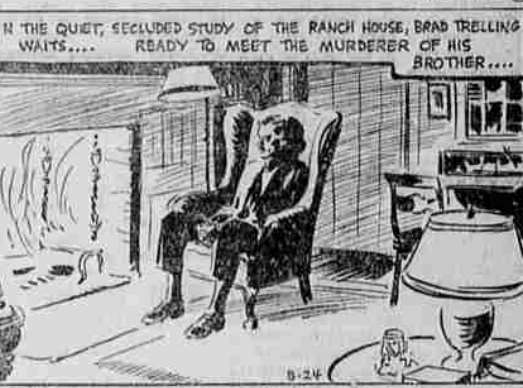

30 Nations Next Door Neighbors Due To Air Line

One hundred and forty-seven cities in 30 countries of Central and South America have been made virtual next-door neighbors of Pacific Northwest cities through the perfection of fast air express-passenger connections along the west coast. It was pointed out in a bulletin issued today by United Air Lines and the air express division of the Railway Express agency.

United's Pacific coast line connects at Los Angeles with that of Pan-American Airways leading to Mexico, Central and South America. Not only are passengers able to reach points as far south as Santiago, Chile, in 14 days, but buyers and sellers of the entire western hemisphere are brought closer in their trade relations.
