building a concrete wall from bedrock to a few feet above the surface of the stream, and then filling in with dirt to the desired height, with a slope of about 45 degrees on the lower side of the dam, and a slope of about three feet back for every foot in height of the dam on the water side. This character of dam construction allows for a minimum of pressure against the dam, as most of the water pressure is downward. The earth-fill dam is much more inexpensive than a concrete dam, Cochran said.
