Once during the operation Mrs. Sharp shrieked, "They're murdering my son!" Friends quieted her and her lamentations became submerged in the chanting. The singing continued long after the surgeons were done.

Dr. Miller warned the parents that undue excitement would lessen Wallace's chance for life. He urged that the well-meaning friends remain away until the boy was better.

The throng dwindled away. Quiet enveloped the Sharp home. But science and faith alike watched that "50-50 chance" of Wallace.

Huron of Imbler and bought by Alex Johnson of Forest, top pen of 20 purebred range rams consigned by the Cunningham Sheep company sold for \$35 each; top pen of ten Lincoln consigned by Dick Kriger of Corvallis sold for \$20 each; top pen of three Corriedales consigned by R. W. Phillips & Son, McMinnville, sold for \$35 each; top pen of ten Panamas consigned by Cunningham Sheep company at \$24 each; three pens of ten yearling rams consigned by John K. Madson sold for \$45 each.

"The quality of this ram sale compares very favorably with other sales which I have handled throughout the western half of the United States," declared Colonel A. W. Thompson of Lincoln, Neb., the auctioneer.

F. A. Phillips, president of the Oregon Wool Growers' association, pointed out the importance of purchasing good rams at a price which would encourage the breeders to continue with their breeding.
