### Baltic Stronghold Of Nazis is Taken By Soviet Forces

Austria with the south.

The rail lines are also vital to the supply of the German forces still holding out in northern Yugoslavia.

**Mass for Last Stand**  
The Germans were reported massing troops along the Leita river line just a few miles in advance of Soviet spearheads for a last stand to save Vienna.

One Soviet column threatened to flank Vienna from the south.

Still another column clearing the western tip of Hungary was within five miles of the Austrian border and 40 miles southeast of Vienna.

Far to the north, the great Baltic port of Danzig fell into Soviet hands, a German army newspaper dispatch recorded by the FCC in the United States said. A Soviet communique last night reported only the capture of the center of the city and the greater part of its port area.

Marshal Fedor I. Tolbukhin's third Ukrainian army group rolled up to the Austrian frontier on a 14-mile front yesterday and a free Austria radio broadcast said the Soviets crossed the border at several points, liberating some villages.

The Soviets turned the German defense line based on Lake Neusiedler with the capture of the border stronghold of Koeszeg, 19 miles southwest of the 130-square-mile water barrier and 50 miles south of Vienna itself.

### Americans Freed From Jap Cruelty Reach Native Land

SAN FRANCISCO, March 30 (UP) - Three hundred and sixty-five American civilians rescued from the Japanese by Gen. Douglas MacArthur's troops set foot on their home soil for the first time in more than three years today.

Their reactions as the navy transport which returned them from the Philippines slid into a pier here varied from tears to cheers and sheer disbelief.

Some, like Mrs. Nezzie D. Meng of Denver, and Mrs. Elsie M. Parks of Hibbing, Minn., said they had been so number by the tragic things they had witnessed that even their homecoming could not thrill them.

Mrs. Meng has not heard from her husband, Paul, an airlines official, since she left their home at Iloilo on Luzon Dec. 1, 1941, for a vacation at Baguio. She fears he is dead.

Mrs. Parks, a missionary, said she could not recount the horrible sights she had seen.

Anxious relatives and friends swarmed about the liberates as they came down the gangplank. Some had been waiting for more than four hours.
