### Rails, Autos Lead Stock Price Gains

NEW YORK, April 11 (UP)—Stocks extended yesterday's last hour rise today by fractions to more than 2 points with the railroad and automobile sections again leading.

Trading increased substantially over yesterday's early pace and volume crossed the million-share mark for the first time since March 27.

Activity centered on the motors, notably the low-priced issues. Utilities were strong and active with heaviest trading centering on American Water Works and Electric Power & Light.

Superior Oil of California spurred nearly 4 points in a strong oil section. Steels were in demand, coppers firm.

CHICAGO, April 11 (UP)—Grain futures turned steady to strong on the board of trade today after early bearishness brought on by the government crop report. May wheat and September and December rye rose to new season highs. Advances were pared slightly before the close under profit-taking.

Deferred wheat contracts dropped fractionally on the close under realizing sales. Wheat finished up 1 1/4 to off 1/4 cents a bushel; oats up 1/4 to 2 cents; rye up 1 cent to off 1/2; rye up 1 1/4 to 2 1/4; and barley up 1/4 to 3 cents.

May wheat in the northwest sold at \$1.68 1/4, or within 1 1/4 cents of the ceiling level, and locally May traded at \$1.74 1/4 or within 2 1/2 cents of the ceiling.

received his early education there. He received his master's degree from the university of Colorado and doctor's degree from Denver university. He also did graduate work at the University of Chicago and Cambridge and Oxford universities in England.

### Widely Traveled

Prior to the war he travelled extensively, visiting ten countries in Europe and the Orient. He was a professor in the college of Idaho for nine years, and for four years was a summer extension lecturer at Idaho university.

He was executive secretary of the national board of education of the Presbyterian church in the northwest for four and a half years and was a member of the Oregon council of child welfare. He now is serving on a committee of the National education association.

His addresses here will emphasize world fellowship and will include discussions of the Dumbarton Oaks conference and other phases of the world peace program, including the forthcoming security conference in San Francisco.

Gutridge said that "all you have read, all you have heard, and add your imagination, and that can't compare with the abuse prisoners were subjected to."

He is to return soon to McCaw hospital at Walla Walla for medical treatment.

## Congress Moves To Speed Plans For Demobilization

WASHINGTON, April 11 (UP)—Congress took its first steps toward demobilization legislation today as the army revealed plans to send virtually all physically-fit troops in this country overseas as soon as they can be replaced.

Chairman Andrew J. May, D., Ky., of the house military affairs committee said he believes the fall of Germany is "close enough" for the war department to let congress in on its plans for demobilization and reorganization of the army after V-E day.

He asked Secretary of War Henry L. Stimson to send the proper army officers to a closed meeting of the committee next Tuesday to discuss legislation "to coordinate the general problems with which we will all be concerned."
