

### Northwest Free Of Coal Limitation

PORTLAND, Ore., April 26 (UP)—Newest OPA coal restrictions limiting consumers to ordering only 80 per cent of their annual needs don't apply to Oregon, Washington, and Idaho—and northwest coal dealers who received information on those restrictions may disregard them. J. H. Gatewood, assistant northwest area distribution manager for the solid fuels administration, said today.

However, conservation programs continue, and consumers still must file statements with dealers of their annual needs and amounts of coal on hand.

Detectives, meanwhile, believed they were progressing in the search for the fugitive and convict, who disappeared shortly before the child's body was found.

### Transport Flyer Gets Air Medal

Award of the air medal to Flight Officer Lenn M. Pierson of La Grande is announced in a bulletin from headquarters of the India-China division of the army air transport command in India.

The award was made when Pierson completed 150 hours of operational flying of transport planes carrying military supplies over the famous "hump" of the Himalayas between India and China.

The citation accompanying the medal said: "Flying at night as well as by day... through treacherous weather... requiring courageous and superior performance of his duties... he accomplished his mission with distinction..."

### End of Jap Sea and Air Power Seen

ABOARD ADMIRAL TURNER'S FLAGSHIP OFF OKINAWA, April 26 (UP) — Vice Admiral Richmond Kelly Turner, commander of Pacific amphibious forces, said today that Japan's ability to mount major air and naval attacks against U. S. operations was "nearly finished."

Turner, who was marked for "elimination" by radio Tokyo, declared there was "no question" the invasion of Okinawa will be concluded successfully and hinted at greater blows against Japan in the future when he added:

"I think our take-off from here will be quite effective against the main Japanese military power."

Turner, a thorn in the side of the Japanese from Guadalcanal to Okinawa, termed enemy suicide air attacks "ineffective."

Referring to the four major air onslaughts against U. S. forces around Okinawa and the "suicide" naval task force which was almost annihilated

April 7, the admiral said: "If this is the best the Japs can do, I think they've shot their wad. I believe we cannot only take what they are trying to give us, but we can take a lot more while delivering additional punishing strikes in return... Japan's ability to attack is nearly finished. Not only will we stay here but possibly we can do more."

He described the efforts of Japanese suicide pilots as "amateurish" and asserted they are neither effective nor good military practice.

### VETERAN ATTORNEY DIES

PORTLAND, Ore., April 26 (UP) — Funeral arrangements were pending today for John A. Collier of Portland, leading criminal lawyer of the northwest who died Tuesday, after incomplete recovery of a heart attack suffered six months ago. He was 70.
