# ARMISTICE TERMS MADE KNOWN

WASHINGTON, Nov. 11.—The state department announced at 2:35 o'clock this morning that Germany had signed the armistice at 5 o'clock, French time.

## New Government

COPENHAGEN, Nov. 11.—The text of the statement issued by the new people's government in Berlin follows:  
"In the course of the forenoon of Saturday the formation of a new German people's government was initiated. The greater part of the Berlin garrison and other troops stationed there temporarily went over to the new government."  
"The leaders of the deputations of the Social Democratic party declared that they would not shoot against the people. They said they would, in accord with the people's government, intercede in favor of the maintenance of order. Thereupon, in the offices and public buildings the guards which had been stationed there were withdrawn."  
"The business of the imperial chancellery is being carried on by the Social Democratic deputy, Herr Ebert."  
"It is presumed that apart from the representatives of the recent majority group three independent Social Democrats will enter the future government."

WASHINGTON, NOV. 11.—(BY UNITED PRESS).—PRESIDENT WILSON THIS AFTERNOON TOLD CONGRESS AND THE WORLD THE TERMS WHICH GERMANY ACCEPTED WITH THE SIGNING OF THE ARMISTICE. THE TERMS PICTURED GERMANY SURRENDERING ABJECTLY TO MARSHAL FOCH IN THE FIELD; HER ARMIES BEATEN; HER GOVERNMENT OVERTHROWN; HER MASTER IN FLIGHT. THERE WAS A SMALL ATTENDANCE AT CONGRESS, AND A SMALL CROWD WHO HEARD THE PRESIDENT'S BURNING WORDS, BUT ENTHUSIASM RAN RIOT.

**TERMS OF THE ARMISTICE**

**MUST ABANDON TREATIES.**  
Abandonment is required of the Balkan and first treaties and the evacuation of all the Black sea ports.

**FOURTEEN DAYS TO LEAVE.**  
The abandonment of Alsace-Lorraine, Luxembourg and all the occupied territory must be completed within fourteen days. The occupation by the allies and the United States forces, jointly, will keep pace with the evacuation.

**REPARATION IS REQUIRED.**  
All the inhabitants of the occupied territories must be repatriated within fourteen days.

**SURRENDER OF MUNITIONS.**  
The German army must surrender in good condition, 5000 guns, heavy and field pieces, 30,000 machine guns, 5000 mine throwers and 2000 airplanes.

## German Autocracy Overthrown

Proceeding the signing of the armistice, the autocracy of Germany definitely passed out of existence and the rule of the people is in full sway.

On Sunday, Berlin, the German capital, following many of the principal cities of Germany joined the ranks of the revolutionists.

A Copenhagen dispatch of Sunday announces that Friedrich Ebert, Socialist, has become the German chancellor, succeeding Maximilian.

The Wolff bureau, the semi-official news agency of Germany, states that this action was for the purpose of securing assistance in the solution of the demobilizing problems.

A proclamation of the new chancellor announces that plans will be made for the formation of a people's government.

**YANKS TRAIN FOR WAR WITH WOODEN GUNS**  
The speed with which industry armed America for war will go down in history as one of the world's economic phenomena. Up to Pearl Harbor, America's production was a record, but only about one-fiftieth of it was for national defense, and 7 or 8 million persons were unemployed.

U. S. armed services were training with makeshift, wooden guns and make-believe tanks. Conversion to war production presented gigantic problems of directing the nation's manpower and materials into the most expedient channels as soon as possible.

After manufacturing capacity was completed, the bulk of the nation's resources shifted from building plants to manufacturing fighting equipment. About half of the production facilities engaged in turning out finished products, primarily ordnance, ships and aircraft; another 40 per cent made raw materials such as high-octane gasoline, synthetic rubber or steel.

The staggering production goals set after Pearl Harbor, which were decided by Hitler, were reached and reset higher each year. Production snarls were untangled, assembly lines clicked, and new methods were constantly devised to cut down on time and manpower required.

**ELECTRICITY?**
