LONDON, May 15 (UP)—Ire-
land's attitude toward German
diplomats remaining in Eire was
criticized in parliament today
and prompted one member of
parliament to inquire whether
the Irish might not be harboring
Adolf Hitler.

Laborite James D. Murray, re-
ferring to Irish Premier Eamon
de Valera and the German min-
ister in Dublin, asked that a pro-
test "of the strongest possible
character" be directed "at these
particular people."

10th ARMY HEADQUARTERS,
Okinawa, May 15 (UP)—The
mortality rate among wounded
on Okinawa is under three per
cent. Col. Frederic B. Westervelt,
army surgeon of Carlisle, Pa.,
said today.

He said Okinawa had the best
medical set-up of any Pacific
operation. He also praised the
speedy evacuation system through
which more than 6,000 wounded
have been flown to Guam.
