Markets

Stocks Advance As Trading Increases

NEW YORK, May 16 (UP)—Trading increased in volume and stocks advanced steadily through today's session.

Late in the session gains ranging to more than two points spread through the list. About the only exceptions were the aircrafts, where losses ranged to more than a point in Douglas. This group still felt the influence of a reduced dividend by United Aircraft.

A higher dividend for Johns-Manville sent the stock soaring nearly 4 points to its 1945 high. A dividend increase also sent Allied Stores to a new high. American Telephone equalled its high on declaration of the regular quarterly dividend of \$2.25 a share maintained steadily since 1922.

CHICAGO GRAIN

CHICAGO, May 16 (UP)—Grain futures ruled strong on the board of trade today with interest centered in the expiring May contract. May rye rose to the highest level since 1925. May wheat established a new seasonal peak and May corn equalled yesterday's ceiling.

May corn and oats declined fractionally on the close, countering the upturn in other deliveries. Rye finished the day up 1/4 to 2 cents a bushel; wheat up 1/4 to 3/8; corn off 3/8 to up 3/8; oats off 1/2 to up 3/8, and barley up 2 1/2 to off 1/4.

Active short-covering lifted May wheat to within 3/8 of the ceiling.

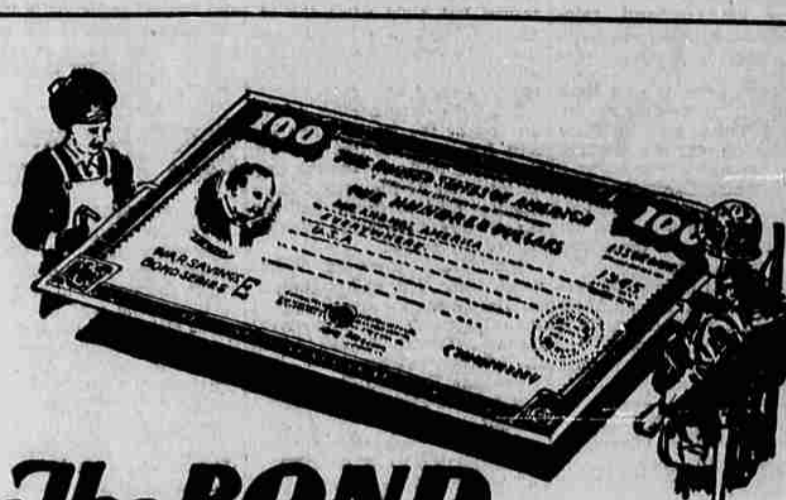
Gas Ration Boost Decision Awaited

WASHINGTON, May 16 (UP)—The office of price administration today reported it is still awaiting word as to how much it can increase the gasoline ration.

"It's all up to the petroleum administrator for war," they said. And the PAW said it is still studying the situation.

OPA spokesmen said that should PAW Chief Harold L. Ickes' most optimistic estimate be borne out, A-card holders will receive 50 per cent more gasoline—or one more gallon weekly.

Some B-card holders, those who drive cars to work, would also get more gas.
