Dodgers Stretch Winning Streak To 10 in Row

NEW YORK, May 16 (UP)—The Brooklyn Dodgers won their 10th straight game last night, beating the Pirates 6-3.

Pitcher Vic Lombardi, gaining his third win, held the Pirates to five hits while the Dodgers made 12, all singles.

The leading Giants won their 10th game in 11 by topping the Chicago Cubs 5 to 4. Phil Weintraub's homer was the winning run.

The St. Louis Cardinals came out of a hitting slump at Boston, beating the Braves 8 to 7 on Elvin (Buster) Adams' three run homer in the eighth.

The Cincinnati Reds made seven unearned runs for all their scoring in a 7 to 3 victory in a night game at Philadelphia.

All American league games were rained out.

Dark Horse Wins Arcadia Feature

ARCADIA, Cal., May 16 (UP)—Gold Mike, California bred six-year-old who was a surprise winner in yesterday's \$5,000 Anita Chiquita feature race at the opening of the Santa Anita track, today was one of 18 horses nominated for the \$25,000 San Gabriel handicap Saturday.

The son of Microphone showed his heels by two and one half lengths to a classy field of 10 headed by 6-5 favorite Civil Code, Charles S. Howard's long legged sprinter.

Gold Mike, ridden by Jockey Francis Zehr, covered the distance in 1:10 3/5. He returned \$38.10, \$12.80 and \$7.70. Vain Prince paid \$5.10 and \$4.10. Bizerte paid \$3.40.

Betting handle in yesterday's feature race was \$329,753, less than the \$257,730 bet on the fifth race when Howard's speedy Sea Sovereign, son of Seabiscuit, an almost prohibitive 1-5 favorite, romped home by four lengths. Total betting handle—\$1,505,295—was a new opening day record for Santa Anita.

Youngsters Get Top Film Spots

Three youngsters of the motion pictures are featured in "National Velvet", the story of a 12-year-old girl who wins a horse in a raffle. The youngsters are Jackie Jenkins, Elizabeth Taylor and Angela Lansbury.

Mickey Rooney is starred in the role of a former jockey who becomes trainer of the horse which is entered in the great English event, the grand national steeplechase, with the girl riding.

Senator Opposes Truman Tax Stand

WASHINGTON, May 16 (UP)—President Truman's rejection of proposals for an immediate reduction in taxes today left congressional circles apparently still determined to press for a five-year program to ease the tax burden on individuals and corporations.

A joint congressional committee on taxation last week proposed the five-year program, including immediate refund of an estimated \$5,700,000,000 to corporations under a clause in the excess profits law authorizing a 10 per cent refund in excess profits taxes.

Chairman Walter F. George, D. Ga., of the senate finance committee, co-chairman of the joint committee, told reporters that he also favored reduction in individual income taxes at the earliest possible date "even if the Japanese war lasts for another year or two."

Tough Reparations Seen For Germany

WASHINGTON, May 18 (UP)—There were mounting indications today that the United States' reparations demands on beaten Germany will be as tough as the traffic will bear.

The attitude of the administration and of administration supporters in congress alike seems clearly to be: "Make the aggressor pay."

Informed quarters in Washington believe demilitarization of Germany will include a rigid control over her industry for many years to come to prevent the manufacture of war materiel.

It doesn't necessarily mean a limitation of German industry and forced return to an agricultural nation and producer of raw products. It is taken to mean, however, control over what German industry produces.

Ickes Plays Waiting Game In Mine Tiff

WASHINGTON, May 16 (UP)—Fuel Administrator Harold L. Ickes was trying today to out-sit President John L. Lewis of the United Mine Workers and anthracite coal producers as the strike by 72,000 Pennsylvania coal miners appeared destined to run its third full week.

The strike, which began April 30, has already cost more than 2,500,000 tons of hard coal.

The length of the strike is said to depend upon how much longer the operator can afford to lose the profits on an output of 100,000 tons of coal daily or the miners their wages for producing that much coal.

LABOR LEADER DIES

CLEVELAND, May 16 (UP)—Abraham Katovsky, 55, international vice president of the International Ladies Garment Workers union since 1934 and militant labor leader, died last night. He was the first Cleveland appointee to the NRA by the late President Roosevelt.
