From 100 to 1000 aliens enter the United States surreptitiously each day in normal times.

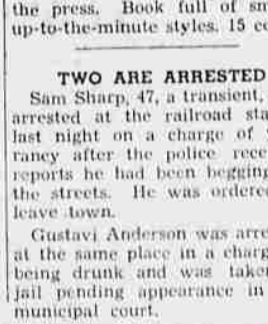
