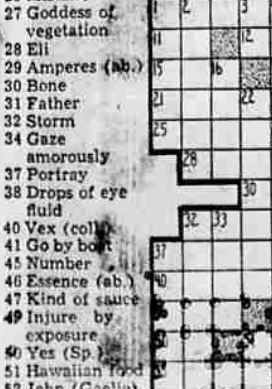

All of the various weapons used by the doughboys in fighting the Germans and Japs will be on display and members of the group will be there to explain their purpose and operation. A similar exhibit will be held at the high school grounds prior to the demonstration.

The retreat ceremony in observance of Infantry day, will be held at Eastern Oregon college at 7:30 p. m., with cadet nurses, boy scouts, and members of the American Legion and Veterans of Foreign Wars participating.

Foster Sims, committee chairman for the sponsoring Elks lodge, today requested that members of the four groups be at the college at 7:15 p. m.

Following the ceremony the band which is a part of the army group, will parade to the high school and will present a concert as a preliminary to the warfare demonstration, which is scheduled to start at 8:45 o'clock.

Half the demonstration will take place under the lights, and the remainder in darkness.

The north gate to the high school field will be closed but all others will be open.

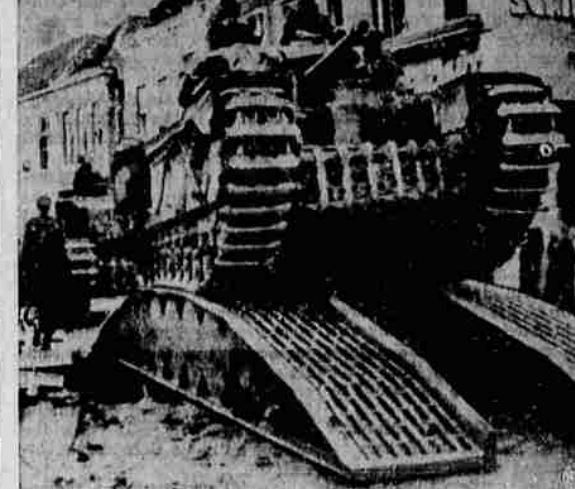

### Aircraft Utility Shares Lead Gains

NEW YORK, June 13 (UP)—Aircraft and utilities advanced to new highs today to feature a moderately active, firm stock market.

Airplane company shares registered gains ranging to more than 4 points in Wright Aero. New highs were made by Aviation corp., Consolidated Vultee, Bell airplane, Curtiss-Wright issues, Grumman, Lockheed, National aviation, North American aviation, Republic aviation, and Douglas aircraft. This group provided the heaviest turnover of any section.

Utility common stocks moved ahead and the average set a new high mark since March 24, 1937. Preferred utilities had gains running to more than 5 points. The main list of rails firmed. Sugar issues were strong, and Schenley led the liquors higher with a gain of more than a point.
