that it is not a tax levy in the true sense of the word, inasmuch as it will not impose any burden on property taxpayers, since the money will be taken from funds already accumulated by the state from income taxes.

On the contrary, the proposed cigarette tax is meeting considerable opposition, and much less popular support.

The measure designed as a permanent source of about \$2,000,000 annually for the common schools, is characterized by opponents as a "sales tax" and "stop-gap" legislation.

**Registration Drops**  
Since the last general election the voting strength of the state has declined sharply, the drop in Union county being 32 per cent. The decrease is attributed to two factors, failure of the voters to cast ballots in the last two years, and removal from the county.

The number of voters eligible to cast ballots tomorrow in the county was announced today by County Clerk C. L. Graham as 6,853. This compares with 9,012 for the general election last November.

The decrease in registrations has been heaviest among the Democrats, the dominant party in the county, which lost 1,338 members or 26 per cent of the 5,082 registered last year, leaving 3,744 eligibles at the present time.

The Republicans, with a November, 1944, registration of 3,922, lost 864 registrations, or 22 per cent, and leaving 3,058 as potential voters tomorrow.

Thirty-two other registrations were cancelled by Graham, one each being progressives and prohibitionist, three socialists and 27 miscellaneous, including those who declined to state party preference.

shook the ship in the vicinity of the baka bomb, which has been thought to be a rocket-propelled projectile launched with a pilot from a plane, was described by eye-witnesses as a low mid-wing monoplane with rounded wing tips. The witnesses said they saw no human being aboard nor was a cockpit observed in the brief glimpses they had before it hit the ship.

Many of the Abele's crew were trapped in compartments and went down with their ship. Several lost their lives when a Japanese plane dropped a bomb among survivors on a little raft after the vessel had been abandoned.
