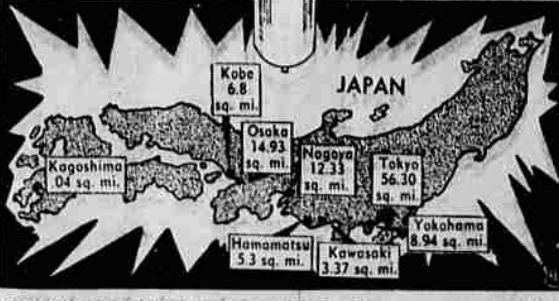

Markets

Stocks Get Setback After Early Advance

NEW YORK, June 22 (UP) - Weekend realizing and moderate selling on fears over higher margins in the near future brought irregular tendencies into the stock market today after a raise earlier to new highs for more than eight years in the general average.

A sizeable group of leading issues, including steels, some motors, rails, and special issues, registered small declines. A majority continued to display gains, however, although the averages were adversely affected.

Profit-taking hit the rails which had been the outstanding performers of the week. Airlines registered gains with American at a new high. Oils held small net gains. Coppers turned irregular after American Smelting made a new high. Utilities had a few firm spots. Chrysler firmed while General Motors eased.

CHICAGO GRAIN

CHICAGO, June 22 (UP) - An unsettled trend prevailed in rye futures with the strong mid-session rally erased under a wave of late selling. July delivery tumbled three cents from the day's best level. Other grains declined.

Rye finished the day off 1 to 2 1/2 cents a bushel; wheat off 1 1/2 to 1 3/4; corn unchanged to off 1/4; oats off 1/4 to 1/2.

Better weather and reports that larger quantities of new wheat are being sold in the Kansas City market for shipment next month at about four cents over the Kansas City July price prompted weakness in the local wheat pit. The trade also looked for increased corn receipts to slacken the demand for wheat.

Corn and oats both reacted to the government pig report revealing pork estimates far below expected goals.

Stamping Out of German Dominance Of Europe Urged

much lower than they assumed under Hitler.

21st ARMY GROUP HEAD-QUARTERS, June 22 (UP) - The allies plan to stamp out the German general staff for all time by splitting its members into small groups and exiling them in detention camps outside Germany.

Gen. Sir Bernard L. Montgomery, commander of British occupation forces, disclosed the allied plan to smash Germany's war makers during a press conference at his headquarters.

He also revealed that gestapo chief Heinrich Himmler's brutal SS storm troopers will be detained in camps in north Germany for the next 20 years to insure that they, also, will not be able to launch the reich into a new war.
