Recovery Marks Wall Street Trading

NEW YORK, June 30 (UP)—Stocks rallied today after three sessions of decline and volume lightened.

Net gains to more than a point were spread over a broad list. A few had gains running to 2 points, notably Eastern Air Lines and Bell Aircraft. The latter made a new high for the year. Pan-American and Penn Central reached new highs in the airlines, with Penn Central up 2 1/2 points.

Steels advanced in most instances and the motors firmed with Willys-Overland, the feature, up more than a point. National Distillers rose a point in an irregular liquor list. Sears Roebuck gained 2 points in the mercantiles which generally were steady to firm. Rails rose in most instances.
