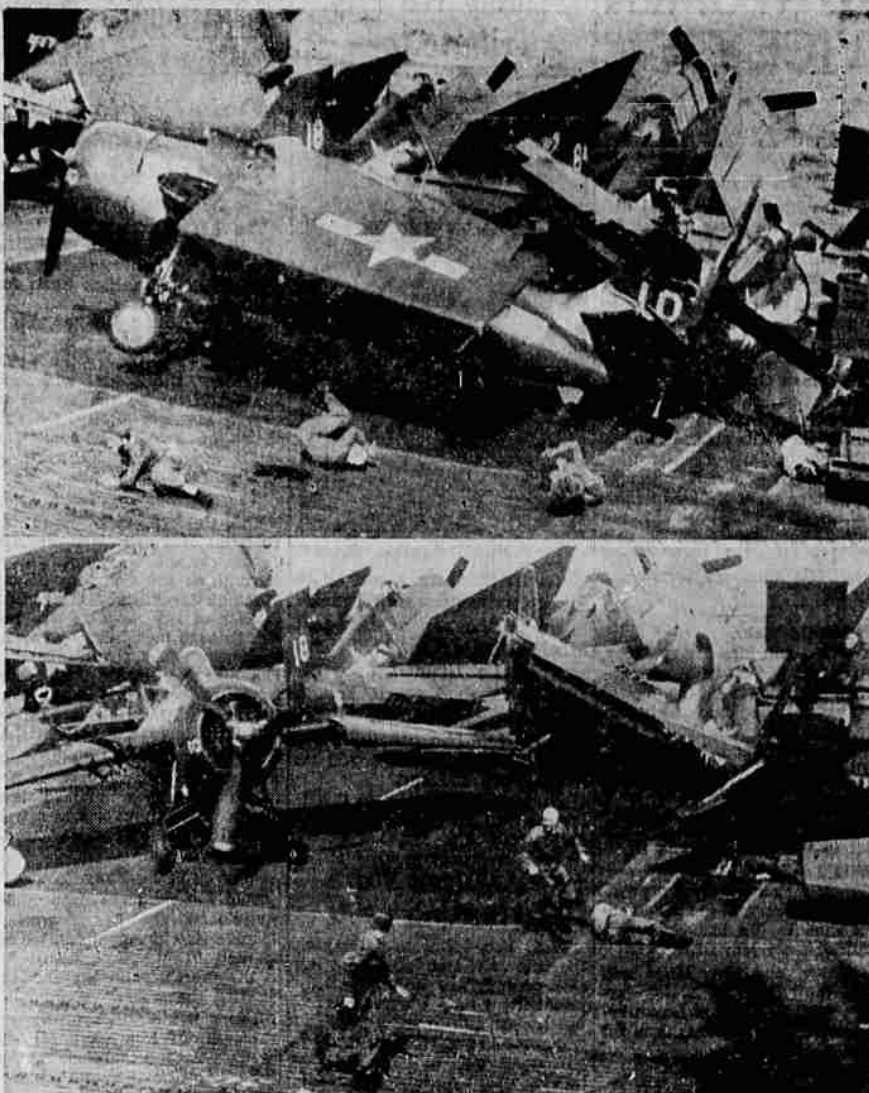

## 230 Miles an Hour Winds Found Over Japan, Says Flier

By REUEL S. MOORE WASHINGTON, July 7 (UP)—

Very high winds over Japan forced changes in plans for bombardment of the enemy's home islands, Lt. Col. Patrick B. McCarthy disclosed today.

McCarthy, who flew the first scouting flights over Japan from the Marianas, said winds blowing sometimes at more than 230 miles an hour were discovered during those first reconnaissance flights.

While they changed bombing plans, however, they did not affect the net result, McCarthy said.

### 25,000 Feet

He said the winds were found at altitudes of 25,000 to 30,000 feet, generally blowing from west to east. The highest velocities—170 to over 230 miles an hour—were discovered from Nov. 1 to Feb. 1, he said. In summer the winds blow at around 80 miles an hour.

These winds continue over Canada and the United States. In winter they would be capable of blowing a Japanese balloon bomb to this country in two days, McCarthy said by using the winds a B-29 could easily fly from Guam to Washington.

### Well Studied

Photo reconnaissance B-29s flew 17 missions over Japan from the Marianas before the first bombing raid on Honshu Nov. 22, McCarthy revealed. Those early reconnaissance flights provided weather information as well as maps and photos.

Weather reconnaissance planes also make regular flights over Japan. All planes including the bombers report weather information. Between photo and weather reconnaissance planes and bombers there is hardly an hour now without weather reports being available from directly over Japan.

### More Reduction in Pullman Services In Next Few Weeks

WASHINGTON, July 7 (UP)—

Civilians, barred from sleeping cars on train runs of 450 miles or less, today faced the prospect of even greater reductions in sleeping car accommodations soon.

Further cuts in sleeping car use for civilians may depend on the extent to which the 450 mile limit, which goes into effect July 15, eliminates conditions which today are forcing thousands of soldiers to travel long distance in day coaches.

About 895 additional sleepers are expected to be available to the armed services as a result of the 450-mile order, announced late yesterday.

Whether that additional number of cars will handle the large numbers of troops pouring into east coast ports headed for various parts of the country is problematical.

### U. S. Air Forces Hit Jap Shipping

CHUNGKING, July 7 (UP)—

Fighters and bombers of the U. S. 14th air force are continuing to hammer Japanese shipping in the Gulf of Tonkin, where enemy troops were reported fleeing Indo-China in junks and sampans, a communique announced today.

P-51s and B-25s struck at small boats loaded with enemy personnel. In north China, American airmen hit IV railroad locomotives, a troop barracks and four ammunition dumps. One plane was lost.

Chinese ground forces have recaptured Pinghsiang, Kwangsi province border town on the main highway to Indo-China, a Chinese communique said, declaring the Japanese fled southward "with our troops at their heels."

### Truman Signs Oil Output Legislation

WASHINGTON, July 7 (UP)—

President Truman today signed legislation extending the navy's authority to produce an average of 65,000 barrels of crude oil daily from the Elk Hill naval petroleum reserve to Dec. 31, 1946. Previously the navy was allowed to take no more than 65,000 barrels in one day, rather than on an average basis.

### Churchill Takes Rest In France

LONDON, July 7 (UP)—Prime Minister Churchill has left London for a short vacation in the Hendaye area of southwestern France near the Spanish frontier, his official residence at No. 10 Downing street announced today.

"The prime minister has left for southern France where he hopes to have a few days rest before attending the Berlin conference," the statement said.

It described the visit as of a "purely private character," to which the French were in every way agreeable when consulted some time ago.

Churchill will stay in a manor house near Hendaye. The French government made the necessary arrangements for security and the British government for communications. Churchill will be in contact daily with the government here. Mrs. Churchill accompanied him.

### Truman, Byrnes Not To Fly in One Plane

WASHINGTON, July 7 (UP)—

The White House disclosed today President Truman and Secretary of State James F. Byrnes will use separate planes if any air travel is involved in their trips to and from the impending big three conference near Berlin.

Byrnes is legal successor to Truman. If anything should happen to both of them, Secretary of Treasury Henry Morgenthau, Jr., would become president. Morgenthau's resignation does not become effective until after Truman's return. Then Fred M. Vinson will become secretary of treasury.

The separate air travel plans, the White House said, have been arranged to insure that any air accident would not kill or incapacitate both the president and the secretary of state.

### Close Exchange

NEW YORK, July 7 (UP)—The

stock exchange was closed today in the first of a series of summer holidays set for each Saturday until Sept. 1. The exchange may adopt the Saturday closing as a permanent fixture in September, according to some commentators.
