

WAC Attacked; Robbed in City

NEW YORK, July 12 (UP)—A pretty, red-haired WAC was raped and robbed in a Bowery doorway early today by three men who also assaulted her soldier companion.

Two men were arrested for the assault. The WAC's name was withheld by police. Her companion was Pvt. Clifford R. Davis, veteran of action in New Guinea.

Jack Colletti, 20, and Phil Fusco, 20, were booked on suspicion. They said they knew the third man only as Angelo.

Private Davis is a patient at Halloran hospital where the WAC is stationed. They had overnight passes and were walking along the Bowery when three youths sprang from a hallway and seized them. Davis broke away after a scuffle, during which he said one man drew a knife. The soldier ran to the East Fifth street police station for help.

Gonski Causes Mild Sensation in City

PHILADELPHIA, July 12 (UP)—Wistful little Gonski caused a mild wave of confusion and consternation today in Philadelphia's streets, bars and restaurants.

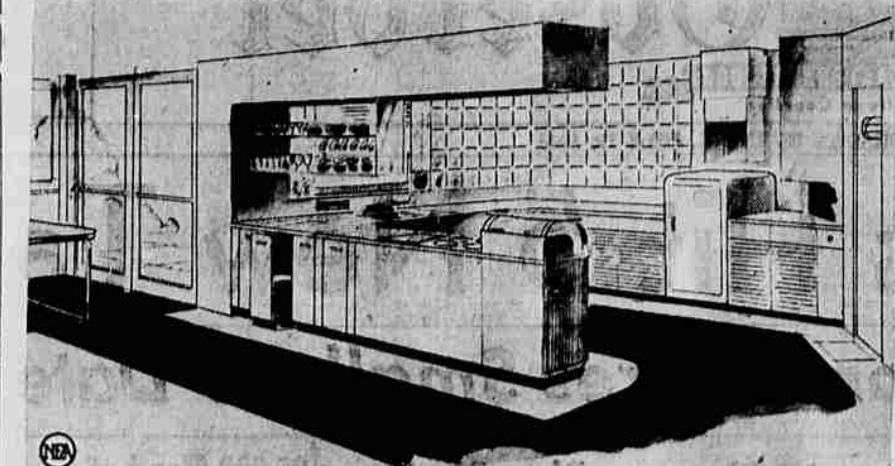

Women Plan Postwar Kitchen

NEW YORK — The postwar kitchen must be the most attractive and modern room in the house, say the women who are planning on new homes in the near future.

If they must spend the better part of the day preparing three meals and tidying up afterwards, they point out, then they want the lightest, airiest, most scientifically equipped room possible.

"More windows" topped the list of "musts" demanded by the thousands of women who took part in a recent kitchen contest conducted by Western Family. Some wanted entire sides of glass and many others also wanted glass sliding doors opening onto a tiled terrace for al fresco dining.

Breakfast nooks were ruled out completely. Instead of cramped cubicles, they suggest a glassed-in section just off the kitchen, which extends past the actual building line.

Time-Savers

U-shaped work centers are the answer to how to conserve energy, say these amateur architects. Also in demand were a deep freeze unit in the refrigerator, so that shopping could be done weeks ahead; fluorescent lighting in the ceiling and a light in the oven as well as over the range; a place for the telephone and radio, and a large mirror for personal check-up before answering the doorbell.

Answering the dream of most women is the prize-winning sketch above by Mrs. Dorothy Downing of Santa Monica Calif.

Pointing out the features of her ideal kitchen, Mrs. Downing says:

"My air conditioned dream kitchen exposes view to the east, south and west. A wide, sliding plate glass window is set into the all of glass brick which extends up and overhead, skylighting 12 inches of ceiling.

"Fluorescent lighting in the ceiling follows the pattern of the U-shaped work center below, one side of which includes a stove and counter that fits out into the room. This separates the glassed-in breakfast corner from the work center and allows access from either side. So does the transparent cupboard suspended above the tiled counter which has chairs concealed in the cabinet beneath.

"At the curve of this 'U' are a double-basin sink, garbage disposer and dishwasher. Completing the work space are the refrigerator with revolving shelves and freezing storage compartment, and a long counter with a service window opening into the dining room. At the end of this, a dumbwaiter travels down to the basement, up to the master bedroom — making it easy to serve breakfast in bed—and thence to the recreation room.

"The door into the dining room is opened automatically by stepping on a floor panel. And for that last look before entering it, there is a half-length mirror."

New Cars To Be Off Ration List Jan. 1

WASHINGTON, July 12 (UP)—New passenger cars, which already are in production, may be ration-free by next January—but most Americans probably won't be able to get one for some time afterward.

War production board believes enough materials will be available during the next two months to allow manufacturers to make more cars than their present quotas. Those call for some 690,000 new cars by next March 31.

There was no estimate of the exact number of new autos the industry will be able to make if materials are more plentiful. But Henry P. Nelson, WPB director of reconversion, told a press conference new cars could be removed from the ration list by January.

Until then, essential users such as doctors, law enforcement officers and some war workers will get first call.

SHAEF Dissolves

PARIS, July 12 (UP)—Supreme headquarters of the allied expeditionary forces (SHAEF) and the combined allied command will be dissolved, effective at 12:01 a. m. July 14, it was announced today. Maj. Talbot Patrick of Goldsboro, N. C., chief press officer at SHAEF, said the process of dissolving headquarters was almost completed at the I. G. Farben Industrie buildings in Frankfurt.
