First Lt. Marion E. (Bud) Reynolds, La Grande marine officer, has been awarded the Silver Star medal for heroism in action on Iwo Jima, the marine corps announced today. He was decorated at Camp Pendleton, Oceanside, Calif., where he now is stationed.

The action which won Reynolds, a former La Grande high school and Willamette university football star, the decoration took place after fire from a Japanese pillbox had checked the advance of a marine infantry company.

Reynolds volunteered to go forward as an observer for a mortar platoon, and made his way, under fire, to within a few feet of the enemy position. Then he called down mortar fire so close to his own post that he was wounded by one of the shell fragments, the citation accompanying the medal said.

Despite the wound, he continued to direct the firing until the pillbox was destroyed.

Lieutenant Reynolds, 28, joined the Marines shortly after being

graduated from Willamette university in 1942. He was overseas 25 months, seeing duty at Midway as well as Iwo.

The La Grande officer is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles H. Reynolds of 1507 First street. His wife, the former Muriel Eileen Webb of La Grande, is now with him at Oceanside.

Orville Bowers, GM 1/C is leaving today for Longview, Wash., after spending part of his 30-day leave at the home of his sister-in-law, Doris Bowers, 1809 X avenue. He entered the service in October, 1942, and had spent 30 months in the south Pacific.
