## Transport Corps Has Anniversary

PORTLAND, July 31 (UP)—The army transportation corps celebrated its third anniversary today at a time when its power was never more needed to carry the war to the enemy. Col. Robert L. Allen Jr., commanding officer of the Portland port of embarkation, said today.

He pointed out it was the transportation corps which provided the link between home front production and the fighting men on the battlefields of Africa, Italy, Normandy and Germany and every island from Guadalcanal to Okinawa.

"This has been a war of supply in which hitting power of infantry, artillery and air power has been coupled with transportation," he said.

Anti-aircraft guns could not reach a plane flying 3000 feet high at the beginning of World War I.

## B-32 Tailor Made For War on Japan; Has 'Sunday Punch'

horsepower engines.

There won't be as many B-32's as Superforts in the Pacific war. Output on the former had not reached top speed when the air forces cutback was announced.

### Last Word in Design

But the B-32 brings into combat a bomber tailor-made for the Japanese war. These two aircraft originally were designed to the same specifications, and the first experimental B-32 took to the air 10 days before the first flight of the XB-29.

While production of the B-29 was being pushed, many changes suggested by combat experience and development of new equipment were incorporated into the B-32. The result can safely be called the last word in heavy bombardment aircraft design.

Fliers assigned to the B-32's are experienced aviators. Pilots (airplane commanders) are really the proper term) and co-pilots have about 1,000 hours of four-engine flying under their belts, and they get 50 additional hours of training.

### Props Act as Brake

The big bombers get 12 hours of checking over after 25 hours in the air. The 50-hour check is even more comprehensive. And at the 100-hour inspection, the plane is almost literally taken apart and put together again.

For most of the passengers on a demonstration flight the piece de resistance was the operation of the reversible pitch propellers. (The B-32 is the first land plane to have them.) The inboard propellers are reversed a moment after landing to act as a brake. And they really act, for which many pilots will probably have reason to be thankful if they ever have to set 50 tons of bomber down on a short runway.

## Shipbuilder's Will Up For Probate

PORTLAND, July 31 (UP)—Admission to probate of the will of shipbuilder Joseph R. Bowles today indicated it was valued materially in excess of \$500,000.

The 75-year-old world war I industrialist headed the Columbia Shipbuilding corporation. He distributed during his lifetime a large part of his fortune to private charities.

His widow, Mrs. Berenice C. Bowles, was the main beneficiary in the will, which named a daughter, Marion V. Bowles, executrix and said she had been previously been provided for adequately.

## King George Will Greet President

LONDON, July 31 (UP)—Well informed Whitehall sources said today President Truman will land in British soil late this week and be greeted by King George.

Informants reported the king will go to some British port, probably Plymouth, to welcome Truman to Britain in a meeting unprecedented in royal history.

Indications were the meeting will occur Thursday or Friday.

The king originally was scheduled to leave London by special train tonight, the Whitehall sources reported, but the plans were changed because Premier Stalin's indisposition delayed the Potsdam proceedings for two days.

## Van Wormer Has Large Collection of Antiques

ert Burns being made poet laureate of the Masonic order, a position created for him. The picture was made from drawing plates destroyed by fire in the eighteenth century. Two prints had been made, but after the loss of the plates, the committee abandoned the project. Mr. Van Wormer acquired the picture from "a man whose integrity might be doubted," and the other is now in Burns' Museum in Edinburgh, Scotland.

The collection also includes one item which has adapted itself remarkably well to the passing ages—an adjustable porch lamp of undetermined age which was made for candles, remodeled for coal oil, and is now wired for electricity.

### Have Churn

Among his early American items are a 100-year-old melonidion which belonged to Mrs. Van Wormer's mother, a caster which stood on his grandmother's table for years, and a chenille officer's blanket used by his uncle when he fought with the ninth Michigan cavalry in the Civil war.

There is also a churn in good working order, but the Van Wormer's prefer an electric mixer for relief from the butter shortage.

### Indian relics include spearheads

and the Wisconsin river, mauls (with thong grooves) from eastern Oregon, and pestles used by the Indians for grinding grain.

These antiques are just a few of the many contained in the collection, but the items are too numerous for individual mention.

### Restored Items

Van Wormer has restored and remodeled a few of the antiques, too, among them a dressing table made from a 50-year-old organ, and a padded canopied black walnut bed.

Van Wormer, a city commissioner since 1936, has lived in La Grande since 1925, coming here from Michigan. He followed sawmilling, starting in 1911, but is now retired. He is an active member of the Masonic lodge, and in 1924 received the royal arch degree from the Melrose, Scotland, order, the oldest continuous Masonic lodge in the world.

## Aussie Artillery Slams at Japanese

MANILA, July 31 (UP)—Austrian artillery pounded today at Japanese rearguard units northeast of the Sungai-Wain river, north of Balikpapan on Borneo, as enemy troops continued their northward withdrawal.

U. S. 13th air force and Australian planes strafed airstrips at Jesselton and the area near Bandjermasin, and attacked enemy ground forces in northwest Borneo.

Seventh fleet search planes ranging over the Formosa area sank one junk and damaged four others. In a night attack 20 other junks were strafed in the Pescadoreas.

## Bank Robber Taken Escaping From Rock

SAN FRANCISCO, July 31 (UP)—A Salt Lake City mail robber, John K. Giles, who attempted to escape from the federal prison on rocky Alcatraz island in San Francisco Bay today, was recaptured aboard a boat about to leave for the mainland, police reported today.

The recapture of the 50-year-old convict was announced a few minutes after prison officials had sought the aid of police in a manhunt for one of the few men to attempt escape from "The Rock." Giles was aboard a boat headed for Fort McDowell when he was apprehended, police reported.

## Spain Sends Laval Back to Italy In German Plane

MADRID, July 31 (UP)—Pierre Laval was expelled by Spain today and took off in a plane from Barcelona airport on the first lap of what probably will be a trip back to France to face trial for his life.

### Former Premier Expects To Go Back to France

The plane flew east over the Mediterranean, presumably for Bolzano, northern Italy, from which the former Vichy premier had fled to Barcelona last May in the hope of finding refuge from allied justice.

### No Delusions

But he entertained no delusions he ultimately would be turned over to France. He told newsmen yesterday:

"I guess if Pétain can face the music, I can too."

(A Paris dispatch said France is making hasty preparation to receive Laval with the possibility he may be called to testify in the final stages of the trial of Marshal Henri Philippe Pétain.

(Spain informed France she had decided to send Laval out of the country by the same means by which he had entered. Paris said it was hoped he would land in northern Italy to permit the French to make arrangements to bring him back to France with the maximum possible security against assassination.)

### Same Plane

The plane was the same German Junkers in which he arrived in Spain in the closing days of the European war. Two German nurses piloted the plane and Laval accompanied by his wife.

Up to the last minute, he protested vigorously against his expulsion. He and his wife spent an uneasy night on a couch in a hangar at the airfield after their plane developed mechanical trouble as it was about to take off yesterday.
