

Aug. 20 Deadline For Applications For Antelope Tags

PORTLAND, Aug. 10 (UP)—Applications for the 800 antelope tags to be issued by the Portland office by Aug. 20 to be in time for the drawing the commission announced today.

Only 800 tags have been authorized and a drawing will be held if applications exceed that number. The antelope season will be open Sept. 22 to 30 in all counties having antelope with the exception of two closed areas, Drakes Flat and the Millican-Fort Rock-Wagontire area.

Applications for the 800 deer tags to be sold for the Fort Rock-Silver Lake area for a post-season shoot Dec. 1 to 5 will be held until Oct. 29, the announcement said.

Russia now dislikes Japan's westward expansion into the same areas. That was the reason why Japan struck in 1904 without warning, and beat the Russians before reinforcements could be brought from Europe by the treaty of Portsmouth. That ended the war. Japan acquired southern Sakhalin, Russia's lease of the Lisotung peninsula, control over the south Manchurian railway to Port Arthur, Russian evacuation of Manchuria and recognition of Japan's sphere of influence in Korea, which she formally annexed in 1910. In 1918, some 70,000 Japs who participated in allied landings in Siberia remained until 1925, and withdrew only after acquiring exploitation privileges in the Sakhalin oil fields. The net result of these maneuvers left Russia owning half of a Japanese island, and Japan holding Siberia's only good outlet for commercial access to the Pacific, with rich Manchuria in a state of stalemate among China, Russia and Japan.

The stalemate was broken in 1931 when somebody blew up a section of the Jap's leased railroad near Mukden. The Nips dove in, and in 1932 they made Manchuria a regency under the ex-Chinese Emperor Pu-Yi and two years later they made Pu-Yi emperor of "Manchukuo." Manchuria now was Japanese. Russia had been elbowed out of the Chinese picture Siberia, far from European Russia and much underdeveloped. Feeling the threat of Japanese troops just across the Manchurian border, Moscow feared that Jap operations on the mainland were preludes to attacks on Vladivostok and the soviet maritime regions; so, Russian troops had to be maintained in Siberia even during the darkest hours of the defense against Germany, and the border clashes that for several years had seemed to threaten a new Russo-Japanese war were suspended while both nations attended to more pressing, if not more important, fighting. But, the fundamental conflict that has kept the two nations at sword's points ever since Japan became strong enough to show her teeth, remained unsettled.

It was in fact, more troublesome than ever. It will be eliminated only when Japan is finally removed from the list of world powers and becomes once more, a secondary insular empire of limited and carefully regulated military potentiality.

Stocks, Bonds Go Lower With News Of Japs' Offer

NEW YORK, Aug. 10 (UP)—Stocks and bonds turned irregularly lower today after a strong opening in response to Japan's offer to accept the Potsdam ultimatum. Commodity prices declined.

In London the reaction of the news, which came when brokers were at lunch, sent prices of stocks and bonds higher with greatest emphasis on far eastern issues, including Chinese and Japanese sterling bonds and shares of the Hong Kong Shanghai banking corporation. Gains were maintained at the close, despite profit-taking.

Lumber Shortage Now Is 'Serious'

PORTLAND, Aug. 10 (UP)—The most serious lumber shortage of the war is developing in the Pacific forward areas where inadequate supplies of lumber threaten to retard construction of advanced bases, navy lumber coordinator, commander W. W. Kellogg, said today.

"For many types of essential lumber, inventories are so low that were production to stop, shipments overseas could not continue for more than two weeks," Commander Kellogg added. The navy has resorted to priority shipping in delivery of lumber because of the shortage—brought on by lack of skilled labor in northwest lumbering areas, combined with rapid expansion of the Pacific war.
