Emperor Orders Uncle to Form New Government

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 16 (UP)—Emperor Hirohito today ordered Gen. Prince Naruhiko Higashi-Kuni, uncle of the emperor Nagako, to form a new Japanese cabinet—a selection the emperor apparently hoped would satisfy the allies.

The official Japanese agency Domei said the premier-designate was expected to complete by tonight a full cabinet, replacing Premier Kantaro Suzuki's government which resigned yesterday.

It was the first time in Japan's history a member of the imperial family has been commanded to head the government.

Domei said the prince established his "cabinet organization headquarters" at 3:25 p. m. in a detached palace in Tokyo.

Hirohito "personally took the decision" without consulting the "senior statesmen" when he selected Higashi-Kuni to succeed Suzuki, the Japanese broadcast said.

Exodus Starts From Portland By War Workers

PORTLAND, Aug. 16 (UP)—The exodus of war workers in Portland, Vancouver and Vanport has started, housing authorities from the three areas said today.

The housing authorities, closed for two-day holiday, were expecting record emigration Friday and Saturday, already many have sought to turn in keys, get their deposits refunded and be on their way.

The migration started during the past week with families packing their hard-used cars with children and household belongings and starting for home. At McLoughlin Heights, Vancouver, 63 families left, an increase of 30 percent over the same day in former months. At Vanport, residents were noticed fixing up old trailers, packing and making general preparations for moving.

Some of the war workers plan to go to the apple country in Washington, others to California, others to the bean country in Florida.

Large-scale exports are expected to begin within about three months after the island's complete liberation.

Soong Expected In Washington

WASHINGTON, Aug. 16 (UP)—Chinese Premier T. V. Soong is expected here within a few days to see President Truman and Secretary of State James F. Byrnes. He will stop here on his way back to Chungking from his recent conferences with Premier Josef Stalin in Moscow.

CHUNGKING, Aug. 16 (UP)—Underground secret Chinese radios "whose existence can only now be revealed"—reported today from Nanking, Shanghai, Peking and Canton the people of those cities are quietly awaiting the entry of Chinese troops.
