Salem Tow Car Driver Killed

SALEM, Aug. 17 (UP)—Raymond Howard Stenberg, 34, Portland, was killed instantly last evening when a tow-car he was driving was hurled over an embankment by the weight of a logging truck it had in tow.

Harold Nunn, 16, also of Portland, Stenberg's helper, told state police the logging truck had started to swing from side to side just prior to the accident.

Lend Lease Loading Continues in Ports

PORTLAND, Aug. 17 (UP)—Until further instructions are received from Washington, loading of lend-lease material on Russian ships in the port of Portland will continue, George Powell, assistant Pacific coast director of the war shipping administration, declared today.

Powell said the longshore gangs are being ordered to resume loading most of the Russian ships in the harbor today, after a two-day victory holiday, in spite of an announcement by Leo Crowley, foreign economic administrator, that lend-lease projects will be closed as soon as possible.

"We'll continue operations until Washington advises us otherwise," Powell said. The majority of Russian lend-lease cargo handled in Portland is strictly military equipment.

OPA Says 'Keep Rationing Stamps To Get Tires'

WASHINGTON, Aug. 17 (UP)—The office of price administration said today consumers shouldn't throw away their gasoline ration books and the green stamps in their food ration books.

While no longer needed for buying gasoline, those A, B and C books still will be of help to motorists wanting tires.

A new system of tire rationing, based on occupational driving requirements rather than type of gasoline ration book held by the motorist, has gone into effect.

As for the green stamps in ration book four, you had better hang on because these are the future meat rationing stamps. The green stamp originally was intended to replace the blue stamp.

No more ration books will be printed, OPA advised that airplane stamps for buying shoes also be wisely used until it is determined how long shoe rationing will continue.

Other war-end developments of the home front: Two-pants suits and vests with double-breasted suits appeared definitely slated. Since winter clothing already is headed for retail stores, the first peacetime suits probably will be for spring.

Nylon hosiery production will start soon, now military requirements for nylon are down to practically nothing.

OPA says don't look for removal of any more rationing controls "for several weeks."

Weakness in Rail Shares Hits Market

NEW YORK, Aug. 17 (UP)—Weakness in railroad shares turned the stock market lower today after an initial show of strength. Trading picked up and topped the million-share level. Rails were under pressure at the start of dealings but met the heaviest selling after Santa Fe had hit 80 3/4 for a net loss nearly 7 points.

Other sections of the list responded bullishly at first but immediately after mid-day began to sell off as rails accelerated their decline. Chemicals offered resistance to the late trend, scoring gains ranging to more than a point in allied.
