Meat Output Last Week Showed Loss

CHICAGO, Aug. 21 (UP)—Federally inspected meat production totaled 208,000,000 pounds last week, an 18 percent decrease from the preceding week's 255,000,000 pound output, the war meat board said today.

The board attributed the decrease to the two day victory holiday. Last week's production was compared with 301,000,000 pounds slaughtered in the corresponding week last year.
