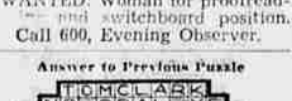

Stocks Rally With Trading Moderate

NEW YORK, Aug. 21 (UP)—The stock market rallied just before the close today after a series of advances and declines earlier in the session. Trading was moderately active.

The late rally started in the rails and spread to most sections of the market. It was caused in part by short covering and partly by the fact that much of the fear selling had run its course. Prices came back easily in many issues, notably Norfolk & Western which regained all of a 3-point decline that had sent it to a new low.
