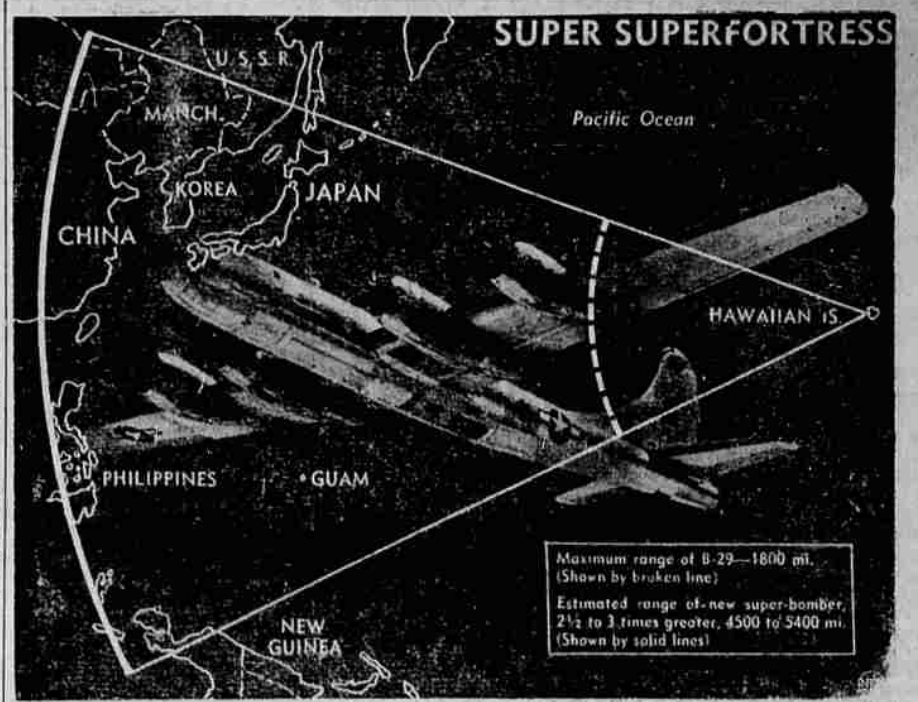

UNCLE SAM HAD PLENTY UP HIS SLEEVE—The atom bomb was far from being the only new weapon Uncle Sam had up his sleeve at war's end, according to Gen. Henry H. Arnold, U. S. air forces chief, who revealed a new superduper bomber whose range makes B-29 Superfortresses seem like something for a local whistle-stop run. The new bomber, so far unnamed, could cover all of Asia, the Pacific and Atlantic from bases now held by the U. S. With range two-and-a-half to three times the range of the B-29 shown in photo-map above, it could fly from Hawaii to the China coast, complete a bombing mission and return to its base. As shown at right, the super-super bomber could circle the earth at the equator—24,902 miles—in three hops.

Franz Werfel Dies; Author of 'Song'

HOLLYWOOD, Aug. 27 (UP)—Franz Werfel, 54, author of "The Song of Bernadette," died of a heart ailment at his home last night.

Werfel, one of the first to write against the nazis, fled from Austria to Paris, then wandered through France, finding temporary sanctuary in Lourdes where he received his inspiration for the story of Bernadette Soubirous.

He came to southern California in 1940 and settled in Hollywood where he said he "felt at home." Upon his arrival he began work on "The Song of Bernadette."

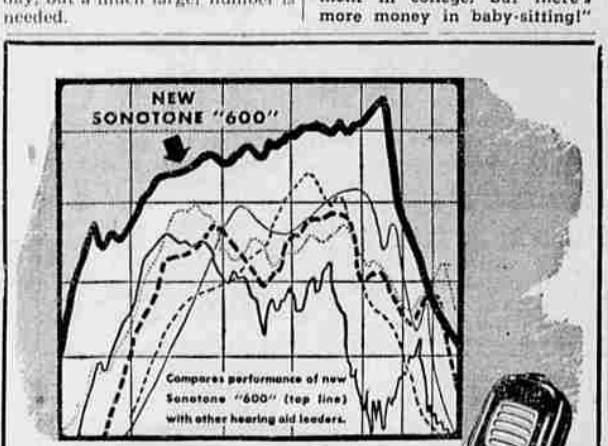

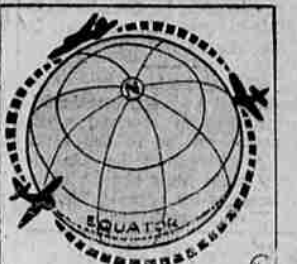
