President Will Visit Missouri

WASHINGTON, Sept. 12 (UP) - President Truman will leave by plane for Kansas City at 1:30 p.m. Friday, taking off in his special four-engine C-54 at the National airport.

Mr. and Mrs. Truman will arrive at the Kansas City municipal airport and proceed by car to Independence. The president will stay until Sunday, and will return to Washington at 6:50 p.m. Mrs. Truman will remain in Independence for a while.

The White House also announced other travel plans by the chief executive. He will be in Statesville, N. C., on Nov. 2 to address an adjourned session of the North Carolina state senate.

Markets

Stocks Firmer as Buyers confident

NEW YORK, Sept. 12 (UP) - The stock market firmed fractions to around a point today, reaching a new high for more than eight years, as investors continued to show their confidence in the future of American industry.

Most of the buying was interpreted as a reflection of several highly optimistic statements on employment, particularly the assertion of the national industrial council that industry now is rehiring rapidly the workers laid off in the first few weeks immediately after surrender of Japan.

Grain Futures Off From Highest Level

CHICAGO, Sept. 12 (UP) - Grain futures reacted from best levels before the board of trade close today with rye off small fractions. Late selling stemmed from weakness at Winnipeg. Before the recession September rye established a new season high and spurred gains in other pits.

Rye finished the day off 1/2 to 3/4 cents a bushel; wheat up 1/4 to 1 cent; corn up 1/4 to 3/4; oats up 1/2 to 1 1/4, and barley up 1/4 to 3/4.

British Women Get Ready for Future

LONDON, Sept. 12 (UP) - Many British women are booking beds in maternity wards as soon as they get the glad tidings that their husbands overseas are coming home, it was learned today.

A shortage of maternity hospital facilities caused a flood of reservations far in advance - many of them made provisionally. All beds but one in a big London hospital were reserved more than nine months ahead.

The papers—teacher's contract, teachers health certificate, and teaching certificate—are to be filed in the superintendent's office before teachers can receive any salary.
